On Saturday morning, a few more people said they were coming so numbers had increased to 67. Saturday afternoon, more people phoned for tickets and so by late afternoon we were up to about 80. This meant at 5 o'clock some of us were in a panic trying to make extra food. WE WANT YOU TO COME! we really do! Thank you to all the people who brought food and helped set up and put away tables at the end. A really fantastic evening.

Future Growth of Mendlesham:

At the time of writing we have held the event on Friday 6th October with the second event on Saturday 21st October 10am Old School Room still to follow. We had a good turnout with good comments from yourselves at the first event and hope for the same on the 21st October. We do appreciate that we seem to be continually asking for your thoughts mainly on the same subjects, all related to growth and planning matters. However this is so important for Mendlesham parish, we need to continue to seek your views in order to make informed decisions for those things we have control over and take forward as evidence for those matters that we do not have the power to decide but can represent your views.

Housing Needs Survey:

Whilst we commissioned a housing needs survey in 2010 and also obtained information from Mid Suffolk District a couple of years ago now for our Neighbourhood Plan, we have just commissioned another survey which we will be asking you to complete early in the New Year.

It has become very clear, that the level of need, some 10-14 dwellings previously obtained, is so much lower that what you tell us when attending meetings and discussing this subject.

More information will follow shortly, but it is essential that whatever your individual circumstances, you or someone helps you complete the questionnaire so that we have the information/evidence so please help. We will need volunteers to distribute the questionnaires on a similar basis as the Neighbourhood Plan questionnaires a few years ago. So if you helped and can help again please can you let the Parish Clerk know.

President Anita welcomed thirty-one members and one visitor to our meeting on 19th September. With us were WI Advisor Andrea Davies and Trainee WI Advisor Claire.

Secretary Linda read the minutes of the July meeting and the report of the very successful Grow-Cook-And-Sew Show in August. Five birthday posies were given to members. Details of several upcoming events were

discussed:- the 'Felting Workshop' on the 23rd September, the Group


Meeting at Eye on the 28th September, Knit Stitch and Yarn on the 4th

October, the 'Christmas Workshop' on the 25th November and the visit to the embroidery exhibition at the Museum of East Anglian life. Orders for WI calendars and diaries were taken. Over four hundred and twenty three pounds has now been raised for the 'Denman Appeal'.

Ann Day our speaker for the evening then talked about 'Brewing in Ipswich'. As a guide taking people around Ipswich, she had a detailed knowledge of the history of the town and explained that the Anglo-Saxons first brewed ale there. Ipswich became very prosperous in Medieval times due to the wool trade so a profusion of hostelries, taverns, inns and alehouses sprang up, each having a different purpose. She showed us some of these old buildings that still exist. Ann then talked about the history of the Cobbold and Tollemache families and their part in brewing in Ipswich, as well as the decline and take-over of Tolly Cobbold. Although major brewing has declined in Ipswich, new smaller breweries have kept the tradition alive in the town. She then explained the difference between ale and beer and how they are made. Hops for the beer were grown up the Gipping Valley and these plants can still be found in the hedgerows locally.

Sheila Mayes won the competition with her tankard.

Our next meeting will be on November 21st in the small hall in the Community Centre. It will be our 'Annual Meeting'. Our speaker will be Geoff Clarke. He will be showing a film of Mendlesham 2016. The competition will be 'a home-made Christmas card'.



Let the Children Come

I hear a great deal of talk about the lack of children in our churches, and the concern about the long-term effect on the viability of our churches and chapels. It is borne out of the fact that most of our congregations are 'ageing', so there is fear of what will happen to the church in say 10 - 20 years' time. One person was asked, 'what will happen to our church when we're no longer here', to which they replied, 'it will probably remain an ageing congregation' – implying that people will continue to seek out a deeper meaning to life in their later years (I hope they're right!).

Yet we can't escape the knowledge that many of us were brought up at a time when Sunday Schools were thriving, where churches invested a great deal of time, energy and resources into the nurturing of children and young people. Children, for instance, on our council estate were 'rounded up' by a lady called Shirley Lawson, who took her own children to the village chapel, and encouraged others to join them – and I was one of them. If it happened now, it would probably be referred to as a 'walking Sunday School bus'!

The times, though, are a-changing (and they were long before Bob Dylan sang about it). In years gone by, church / chapel / Sunday School were one of only a few activities that were available on a Sunday – probably one of the reasons that some boast going THREE times a day and not just for an hour! Nowadays we appreciate that there are so many things to attract children and young people whether out and about or stay at home with electronic gadgets, or, with some, the need to visit a parent on a Sunday.

These are very different times. I recall an occasion when children associated with the local church wanted to join a popular amateur dramatic groups, which started half hour before Junior Church finished. We requested that the children be given permission to arrive a little late to give scope for attending church first, but the request was turned down. I was horrified that these children were put a position that they had to choose.

Having acknowledged though that we find it difficult to compete with these many different demands, I wouldn't want to despair about where we find ourselves, but rather than see it as a challenge. Churches are, for instance, discovering a different way of 'doing Sunday school' especially as an after-school club. This is one of the reason why Messy Church' is so popular providing various activities; readings; singing etc on a Biblical theme and having a meal in the bargain. They're popular because they're fun and available at a time when it suits parents as well as children.

I can also refer to the success of 'Open the Book,' where volunteers take a school assembly, sharing a story from the Bible in word and dramatic form, that goes down exceptionally well with staff and children. They always include an invitation 'for those who would wish' to join them in a short prayer at the end. It always amuses me that a volunteer can be spotted in town by a child who might point them out to a parent and identify them with their latest Biblical character!

Recently a Year Six class were reflecting on some of the horrors that are occurring around our world in an activity that sought to confront the effects of both good and bad choices. They were reminded of the 'rippling effect' whereby a stone is thrown into a pool of water and the ripple extends far beyond its initial impact. Towards the end of the lesson, the teacher suggested that they spend a few minutes in silence, and take the opportunity to reflect on what they had been discussing. It is suggested that every child in the class bowed their head, closed their eyes, put their hands together, and quietly offered their own prayer.

This gives me encouragement for the future that children have the capacity to understand the need and power of prayer. Jesus said 'Let the children come to Me and do nothing to prevent it, for the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these'. I personally think that the teacher was doing just that – allowing the time, space and opportunity for them to approach the eternal throne. I'm sure it's happening in all sorts of other maybe small ways, but let's take heart that acorns are being planted and must surely grow in the things that are of the Kingdom. We might sow and nurture, but it is God who does the rest and our future – and theirs – are in His hands.

Fr Philip Writes...

This month, with her permission, the words in most of this article are those of Marie. We became aware of Marie's story

very recently, when we received a message from the General Secretary of the Guild of All Souls, whom she had contacted about her exhibition in Kesgrave. This portrayed an eight-year-long journey of coming to terms with a child loss caused by a miscarriage. On looking at Marie's website, http://www.grievingmother.co.uk under the tab 'Blog' we found the following:

Walking with Grief

Do not hurry as you walk with grief; it does not help the journey. Walk slowly, pausing often: do not hurry as you walk with grief. Be not disturbed by memories that come unbidden. Swiftly forgive; and let Christ speak for you unspoken words. Unfinished conversation will be resolved in Him. Be not disturbed. Be gentle with the one who walks with grief. If it is you, be gentle with yourself. Swiftly forgive; walk slowly, pausing often. The Guild of All Souls

Marie writes: 'When I found out about the loss of my second child, I was devastated but to my own surprise also terribly relieved. Three years of waiting for this embryo transfer, having treatments, gynaecological procedures, being on hormonal medications for months, worrying every single day, hour, minute whether this child was going to live. At least something was resolved. I knew the score. I felt free for the first time in many years. I fulfilled my promise, I gave everything to this child. Everything for this special baby who I was united with for several precious weeks.

The grief came later, it descended like a hailstorm. I was lost, what I was to do with this life? There was a big black hole inside me where the child had been. The effect of hormonal medicine was lethal. I was fuelled by anxiety and rage, running around the house cleaning. I had to use all my mental strength just not to explode and not to hurt my lovely family. They so wanted to help me but I had to be alone with these explosive emotions. So I took a day off and went for a drive. I wanted to keep driving away from home, away from this painful experience. I wanted to drive and never come back. And then it dawned on me... I had nowhere to go. The only place for me was with my loving family, in the centre of all pain. There was no escape for me.

As I was driving, I found a little church in Mendlesham village surrounded by tall lime trees. It was a quiet time of day and I walked slowly to the church across the pebble path. I stepped in and shut the world away with the door behind me. In the blessed silence and the scent of church wood I walked along the isle and found a place to pray. A prayer was provided and I was grateful. I don't know many. I sat down and prayed. It brought me comfort. I also discovered a small side chapel with beautiful, suggestive paintings on the walls and a candle stand in the middle. The sign said' please light a candle for a loved one you lost'. ... so I did. I lit a candle for the little soul that lived in my body and departed for an unknown reason. I prayed and wept.

I found a poem on the little church table: 'Walking with grief' by the Guild of all Souls. I was so upset with myself that after years of therapy and my own artistic work I was still grieving. I thought I had done with all that. Not yet, there is more bitterness in my cup. A pain to be drunk. So I walked, I walked along the river that afternoon, I walked slowly and I walked with grief.

When I got home I painted. I had to create this big black hole that was inside me. I had to see it for what it was. I painted with my hands the huge black space. I wanted to curl up in the middle of it. But the paper was wet, so I painted instead -turquoise, lime green- slapping the paint on with my palms. I asked myself: what lives in the hole? Red eyes appeared, that was my fear. Then a nose and lips and the lips were moving. Were they talking, screaming? No, they were singing! So I began to sing while a face appeared. An old, wise shaman and we sang together the song of life and death filled with love and sadness.'

Having now had the privilege of meeting Marie, I have invited her to stage her exhibition 'The Grieving Mother' at St Mary's Mendlesham from Tuesday 21st November – Friday 1st December (see separate poster for more information). Inspired by her story and aware of that of many others in Mendlesham and beyond, we are also holding a 'Service of Light' on Saturday 25th November at 2.30pm.

It is for any parents or relatives whose children have died, before birth or at any time after, of any cause and however long ago. Candles will be given and lit, to be carried and placed on the altar of the Lady chapel as a sign of prayer for these children.

It will be short, quiet and reflective, consist of readings, prayers and a little music and open to any who wish to come. It will finish quietly, to allow those who wish to stay or go in silence to do so. However, an opportunity will also be provided afterwards for any who would like to talk to a sympathetic listener.
