Tribute to Ken Ives

It is with great sadness that I have to tell you that Ken Ives passed away peacefully in Ipswich Hospital on 23rd November, with his family around him. Ken was your local Policeman here for 27 years and loved every minute of being your village bobby. When he retired from the Police Force we bought our Police House in Brockford.

Last year he was awarded France's highest honour by the President of France, and received the insignia of Chevalier de la Legion d'honneur for his part in the D-Day Campaign. Afterwards he was taken prisoner and his POW months were spent in Germany before being transported to Poland where he stayed until WW2 was almost over. He was on the 600-mile march back to Germany which took three months in freezing weather.

Ken was a modest man, a wonderful husband, who loved all his family with a passion. He will be missed so much.





The Wise still Seek Him

I have close friends who head for Northern Spain at the beginning of the New Year for a few weeks. This has nothing to do with escaping the ravages of winter in the UK, but everything to do with enjoying the company of good friends that they have known for many years. 'But why not go when the weather can be kinder in Spain?' you might rightfully ask – and the ready answer is that they have fallen in love with 'King's Day'.

Traditionally Christmas Day is celebrated quietly within the family home, but once they get to 6th January the emphasis is on the creation of huge, spectacular parades in every city, town or village of the country, no matter how big or small, where sweets and presents are given to all! It's called LOS TRES REYES MAGOS (*the Three Wise Men*). I understand that thousands of people will crowd into the main roads in order to glimpse the re-enactment of the arrival of the Three Kings into their midst, and the whole thing is described as a wonderful spectacle and experience. Although they recall the gifts that were offered to this Child, Jesus, these days the Kings are more prone to bringing candies and more practical gifts as a special blessing for mostly children.

This occasion to which the Spanish gives such prominence stems from the Gospel account where the Wise travel from the East to worship the child that was born to be King and to offer their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. *(refer Matthew 2: 1 – 12).* They had been made aware of the significance to the world through their interpretation of the stars *(which is why one tradition has it they were astrologers).* Amazingly, they set out on this journey of discovery, not knowing where it may lead them, simply driven by this fervent belief in a message that creation had offered up, and following a star until it led them to the fulfilment of their hopes and expectations.

This is a wonderful example of faith in action to encourage us as we venture into our New Year. For the Wise showed determination and courage to continue in their journey, despite the ridicule of others, the difficulties experienced on the way, the mistakes in relying on their own judgement not that of God's, the dangers faced where secular powers sought to take advantage of their knowledge and searching for their own end, and the fact that they might have doubted initially on discovering that this 'child born to be King' (*Matthew 2: 2*) was not born in a palace but in a stable. Being wise enabled them to see beyond the values of this world, and see God's presence in the unexpected, Despite their status, knowledge and wealth, they demonstrated great humility in the ability to kneel in wonder, joy and excitement at the sight of this new-born child (whom the scriptures describe as 'Emmanuel – God with us' [refer Isaiah 7: 14 and Matthew 1: 23])

The period of Epiphany (a moment of sudden and great revelation) is a time to remind us that we too are called on a journey of discovery until we reach the fulfilment of our hopes and dreams if we have the courage to persevere in our seeking of the One who has come as a gift of love from the Heavenly Father, who guides us along our way, bringing us to the point where we too can kneel in wonder and adoration. After all, it is the wise who continue to seek after the One who has come to reveal the depths of God's love for humankind, and open up the way to Eternal Life.

May God's richest Blessings be bestowed upon you and yours as you venture into the New.

OBITUARIES

Roland (Roly) Frederick Baker – 1921-2017

Roly was born in Stowupland, attended school in Mendlesham and at the age of 14 went to work on his father's farm at Elm Farm, Wickham Skeith. He was called up in 1939 and in 1941 his regiment was sent to fight in Singapore, where he was captured. Roland's years of brutal captivity began when soldiers were transported to Thailand by train. He worked on the Thailand-Burma Railway and during the 3½ years the meagre daily rations of Roly and his companions consisted only of water and rice. They would often be beaten with pick axe handles or bamboo for making mistakes. When work on the railway had been completed the surviving prisoners were transported back to Bangkok docks where they were taken to the borders of Indo-China and put to work on constructing an airstrip. Roly's story is a tale of strength and extraordinary courage.

Roly and his wife Kathleen adopted a son, Raymond. Kathleen died aged 102 and, after a funeral service taken by Fr Philip in St Mary's Mendlesham, Roly was buried with her at Finningham.

Willliam (Willie) Edward Burney

Willie Burney, born in the USA, was the 3rd son of Thelma and Willie Green Burney and came to England with the USAAF during the 1960's. He served as a sergeant for 11 years at Bentwaters Airbase.

After his service in the US Airforce he decided to remain in Ipswich and took up a career training people so they could meet their career goals. In his leisure time he enjoyed reading and charity work - volunteering at Oxfam and for the Samaritans. Latterly he moved to Mason Court, Mendlesham, where he died

on 18th October aged 71 years. He leaves a daughter, Donna. His funeral was taken by Fr Philip in St Mary's church and he was buried in the churchyard.

Fr Philip Writes...

The Epiphany is observed on 6th/7th January as the arrival of the Wise Men (the Bible does not say there were 3, but mentions 3 gifts) to the House in Bethlehem (not the stable) where they

found Jesus, Mary and Joseph. It was some time after the birth of Jesus. As I have mentioned before, it is an ancient custom on this day to bless chalk, which



is then used to write the initials traditionally given to the wise men above or near the main door of the house, together with the year.

Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar are first mentioned in the 6th Century. Melchior is depicted as an old European man with a long white beard and bearing the gift of gold; Caspar as a younger, Asian man, carrying incense and Balthasar an African offering myrrh. man, Another explanation of the initials CMB are the first letters of the Latin blessing CHRISTUS MANSIONEM BENEDICAT (May Christ bless this house).



Since the 15th Century, the blessing of the Plough has been associated in England with the Feast of Epiphany. Plough Monday (the day after Plough Sunday) was the cue to start work on the land after the 12 days of Christmass



and the plough was decorated and brought into church for a blessing. It was then taken on procession through the village. The pagan origin of this was to draw evil spirits from the ground where new crops were to be sown. Like many other traditions, this was later Christianised so that it

became a day of asking for God's blessing on the land.

At Mendlesham this Plough Sunday, +Mike, Bishop of Dunwich, will bless the plough and pray that the work done on farms during the year will bring a good harvest.

For many years the East Suffolk Morris Men have kindly offered their time and talents in dancing in the Parish Mass on Plough Sunday, then afterwards in procession along Front Street and Old Market Street, stopping at the village sign. Bishop Mike will pray here this year for the unity of the parish. Please come and support this celebration; in recent years some of the Morris



Men have expressed disappointment that few residents have come out of their houses to watch them during the procession. We are very fortunate that they choose to visit Mendlesham each year and of course anyone is also most welcome to come to see them at the Parish Mass, where we always pray that their dancing will bring inspiration and joy into our lives.

Finally, our Christian Aid Crib appeal will finish on 8th January. If you have not yet given, it is not too late to do so. Last year's appeal raised £1069.15 (including Gift Aid) for some of the world's poorest people. So often I hear people say that the world's problems are so great that we cannot make a difference. As Kay Florentino wrote:

"I cannot change the world, but I can change a small part of it."

I hope we, in Mendlesham, can once again rise to this challenge.
