


Parish Council: Mendlesham's Woodland:

On a glorious June afternoon, Mendlesham cricketers set out to retain the trophy they had won last summer against a team from Finningham. This time the match took place on home ground with Mendlesham just pipping Finningham by 94 runs! After a poor start, Mendlesham settled into the game scoring over 200 runs in all.

The whole afternoon was great fun and Finningham had the consolation of triumphing in the tug-of-war.

Many thanks to all who spent several hours preparing the pitch and to Rachel for making everyone welcome in the social club.

Jaiger Process engineering supplied the Mendlesham shirts and the trophy was donated by Chris Watson Haulage.

Work of a Parish Council:

This is the first time in ages that Parish Council content for this newsletter has not been dictated by matters that we need to inform you about as a matter of urgency or to meet statutory deadlines. Many of you will have attended the Parish Meeting in April and heard about the work the Parish Council has achieved in the previous year, but you may be interested to know about some of the projects we are working on or matters we have had to be involved in since April. This may or may not surprise you, may differ in importance to different people but is undertaken on behalf of the community by only few volunteers (your Councillors) . If you wish to know more or wish to either become a Parish Councillor (note we have elections next year and a current vacancy) or even help informally, on one particular area, please speak to either a Parish Councilor or the Clerk.

- **Neighbourhood Plan:** work on the revised Plan continues. We hope to have the final documentation ready for consultation/ Health checks by the end of this month.
- **Community Led Housing:** Parish Councillors have attended two presentations to consider options and are currently investigating the best ways to help Mendlesham residents remain or return to the Parish. Our new Housing Survey is now completed, see the summary results on the Mendlesham Web site. <u>http://mendlesham.suffolk.cloud/mendlesham-parish-</u> <u>council/community-led-housing/</u>
- **Planning:** We continue to provide consultation responses to both "normal applications" but also those that are perhaps trying to obtain permissions that in different circumstances would not be considered at all. This is of vital importance to the Parish, to protect our rural community, but also because we do need to grow in the correct way, to retain and encourage our vital services and community assets. This means lots of work providing planning application consultations, more work if a planning application goes to the MSDC planning committee for a decision and then even more work if it then goes to a Planning Appeal. Since commencing the adopted Neighbourhood Plan we have supported around 100 new builds, from a starting position of approximately 620 dwellings in the Parish.

We also have planning enforcement matters to report and work with our partners, with Brockford Road caravans and changes to highway access, currently under scrutiny.

- **Community Centre:** We have a parish council working party continuing to work on administration improvements and premises requirements so that this essential asset meets the needs of the community now and in the future.
- **Playingfields :** At Mendlesham Green we are in the middle of a project to provide more equipment, at Mendlesham working on a major project further to the S106 funding following the Station Fields Development.
- **GDPR:** We have had GDPR requirements to implement and change the way we work.
- **Defibrillator :** At Mendlesham Green we have acquired a defibrillator which is now " live" and work is underway to refurbish the box.
- **Noticeboard** for Mendlesham: We are working towards providing an additional noticeboard for the Old Station Road/Station Fields area.
- **Rights of Way:** we are asking questions about what paths are being kept and why? Plus exploring the possibility of what can be done to increase and improve the number of paths so that they remain accessible, particularly when the grass and weeds grow.
- **Grasscutting:** many areas, including the woodland, allotment land at Mendlesham Green, verges, playingfields and other amenity areas are under consideration with the aim of improving what is currently happening or not! .
- **Traffic:** the project is underway for our own speed signs and we are also aware the Police will be undertaking enforcement action as monitoring data has produced some highly unacceptable trends. Later in the year we want to revise our Mendlesham HGV route to see if any improvements can be found.

So with dog poo complaints, pot holes, flies at Mendlesham Green, anti social behaviour and no doubt the work we have forgotten when thinking about this, life as a Parish Councillor is never boring. However it does make a difference in many different ways and can be extremely rewarding so please help us if you can.

OBITUARIES Hugh Cutting

Hugh was born in Mendlesham and worshipped at St Mary's all his life, other than when he was on active service in Palestine at the end of WW2 as an officer in the Guards – the discipline evident in his upright bearing and appearance throughout his life. Fr Philip says, "I write about Hugh from my relationship with him as churchwarden and regular communicant. I would sum up Hugh as 'a true country gentleman'. I could not have had a more loyal churchwarden when I arrived here in 1974 after a long interregnum, when Hugh and Eric Bauly had to find clergy to keep services maintained." Hugh was trustee of all the village charities; as churchwarden he served on the Church Estate and he was a long-standing trustee of both the Town Estate, the Cutting Charity and the Educational Foundation. He loved 'country pursuits' and was an active member of the British Legion and The Friends of St Mary's as well as other village organisations. He and Margaret hosted several fêtes at 'The Hollies' as well as outdoor Masses and barbeques. They had 2 sons, James and Matthew and 2 grandchildren, Emmie and Sam. In the last couple of years Hugh sadly suffered from dementia and was cared for at Hillcroft Home in Stowmarket. He died in Ipswich hospital aged 91, having received the last rites. The attendance at his funeral showed the esteem in which he was held and he was buried in St Mary's churchyard.



OBITUARIES Barry Warren

Barry was born in 1933 in Gidea Park and one of 3 brothers. He left school at the age of 14 and worked for Eastern Electricity Board as a refrigeration mechanic for 34 years. In 1954 he was called up for national service in the RAF, where he served in Egypt and Cyprus. He married Katherine (Kathy) in 1977 and gained 2 daughters, Ruth and Sharon and 7 grandchildren. They moved to Cotton in 1982 where Barry won many trophies for his flowers and produce. Barry's health began to deteriorate in the 1980s and for many years he had to use a wheelchair. Nevertheless he was still active and taught himself French polishing and furniture making. He and Kathy became communicant members of St Mary's congregation in 1986 and a few years later they moved to Mead Way, when they joined other village organisations. There was rarely a Sunday when Barry was not in church and the attendance at his Solemn Requiem shows the affection in which he was held. He died in Ipswich hospital aged 85, having received the last rites and his cremated remains are buried in St Mary's churchyard.





'Be as Wary as Serpents, and Innocent as Doves!' (Matthew 10: 16)

In a recent newspaper article, an International football manager recalled an event some years previous when he was a member of the country's coaching staff. During an evening off, the players decided they would all play a game of charades, to which the assistant coach was invited to take part. He recalled being second up, and took a card that said: 'a dancing monkey'. It seems that, keen to make a good impression, he threw himself energetically into his routine, including exaggerated dance movement that including him scratching his armpits, and peeling an imaginary banana.

What he couldn't understand was that, despite his best efforts, everyone sat in front of him stony-faced and staring in amazement at this strange spectacle, so much so that, after a while, he got irritated with them, and started shouting that it was so obvious that they were stupid not to at least offer a suggestion. After someone told him off for speaking, another bright sparks enquired whether he was a dancing donkey – which sent him completely over the top, and in disgust, flopped back down in his seat. It was only then that another member of the coaching staff leaned in and quietly said: 'You don't get it do you? You've been set up by the lads and you've fallen for it hook, line, sinker!'.

It seems that he recalled this incident, both to highlight his competitiveness but also his ability to laugh at himself, and, when everything was taken into consideration, he hadn't minded being made a fool of in front of the whole squad because it was clear they'd done it out of a deep sense of affection and respect.

It reminded me of some of the tales my dad used to say of his experience in engineering, where it was common practice to send the latest raw recruit around the factory enguiring after a 'wooden door handle' or a 'round tuit' and

everyone they approached for advice would know exactly what game was being played, and would fully engage in this wild goose chase.

We discover in the Gospel accounts that Jesus was forever being approached by the religious authorities in the hope of catching Him out; embarrassing Him; or making the laughing stock of their audience. The difference being, of course, that they had not done it out of respect or affection, but out of a deep dislike for everything that He was doing, and everything that He stood for – they failed to grasp or appreciate who and what He was – and so engineered situations where they could isolate Him, condemn Him, and eventually crucify Him.

The utterly amazing thing is, despite everything that they did to undermine His authority and purpose, He mainly engaged with them in a way that sought to highlight a deeper truth (*I say 'mainly' because there were times when He got angry with them, and called them some unsavoury names!*). We have, for instance, the confrontation centred on a Roman coin. It was a coin that the population were forced to use, even though it represented the might of an occupational army. This is the incident: 'The authorities went away and agreed on a plan to trap Him in argument, saying 'Give us your ruling on this: are we or are we not permitted to pay taxes to the Roman emperor?' Jesus was aware of their malicious intention and said, 'You hypocrites! Why are you trying to catch Me out?' Then pointing out Caesar's head on the coin, replied: 'Pay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God.' (*Matthew 22: 15 – 21*)

The important lesson to be learnt is that Jesus was fully aware that they were keen to trap Him. The dilemma being that, if He supported paying tax to the Roman authorities, He would be accused of being unpatriotic. If He openly opposed the paying of taxes He could then be reported as a trouble-maker and rebel! It was like: 'heads they win an tails He loses! His response is: to teach His audience that they have a duty to pay their taxes, but equally to stress that God should also receive His due, through the worship, the love and the service of our whole lives.

In this, and other examples, Jesus shows us how to counter those who would seek to undermine or ridicule the faith we are called to profess, and to meet even our greatest critics with grace and good humour, so that, in the words of a prayer offered by John Proctor: 'We might have the courage to stand apart from others, in our commitment to Christ; and wisdom to know how we might best engage for the sake of His Kingdom'. No wonder He also advised: 'Be as wary as serpents, and innocent as doves!'



Our Summer Festival - the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Patronal Festival of our parish church is

the highlight of August in Mendlesham. I want to consider the meaning of this feast in 3 ways: 1: Life after death; 2: bodily resurrection and 3: our final union with Christ.

<u>First:</u> Life after Death. In the 1960s a man's only son was killed in a road accident and the effect was such that his father had a nervous breakdown. The curate visited him frequently, but the father couldn't accept life after death. His illness grew worse and he was admitted to a psychiatric hospital where there was a radical chaplain who didn't uphold the traditional Christian faith. The distressed patient told the chaplain how kind the curate had been, but said he couldn't believe there was life after death, to which the chaplain replied, *"Don't worry, nor do I."* When the man's wife visited him he said, *"You know, dear, we have a strange chaplain here who told me he doesn't believe in life after death."* His wife replied, *"Don't worry, dear, that's why he's in here."*

The Assumption speaks of the Christian's future hope: Jesus said, "I am going to prepare a place for you... I shall return to take you with me; so that where I am you may be too."

(John 14 v 2-3)

Second:

The Assumption speaks of the resurrection of the body as well as the soul. A Norfolk grave digger of over 80 years was digging a grave when the Vicar came along for a chat and asked how deep he dug graves. *"Them I don't like I put down another 2 feet so they'll be late for the resurrection,"* he replied. We know the resurrection of the body isn't meant in the way that gravedigger implied. It is a bodily resurrection but with a difference. If you were to ask whether your present body is the one derived from your parents, the answer would be yes – and no. Your present body was derived from your mother's womb, but it completely replaces itself every 7 years, so in one sense it is the same and in another it isn't. Our resurrection body will bear characteristics of our earthly body and we will be the same person but will be recreated - like a caterpillar-chrysalis-butterfly transformation. We

know Jesus in his resurrected body could eat and was still recognisable to his friends, but he had new powers and could appear and disappear at will. The Church believes Mary was assumed into heaven after her death as it is unthinkable that the body from which Our Lord's body was derived should moulder in the grave.



<u>Third:</u> The Assumption is the fulfilment of Mary's life, which consisted of several episodes of losing and finding Our Lord. She was at Bethlehem giving birth, but into exile in Egypt to hide from Herod. She lost the 12 year-old Jesus in Jerusalem but found him in the temple. She was with him at the wedding at Cana but lost him when his ministry began. She 'found' him on the Cross at Calvary but lost him when his lifeless body was placed in the tomb. She found him when he rose from the dead but lost him when

he ascended to heaven. She found him in the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and when she died, her Assumption was her call home to Jesus, never to be lost or parted from him again.

This feast is as much a festival of Our Lord as it is of Our Lady. It is <u>he</u> who takes her body to heaven and <u>he</u> who gives her everlasting life. As Mary said when she was carrying Jesus before he was born, "He that is mighty has done great things for me."

What of ourselves? This same Jesus comes to us in scripture, prayer and Holy Communion. We, too, should look forward to our glorification at the end of time when we will be able to say, with Mary, "**He that is mighty has done great things for me.**"
