

### OBITUARIES Vera Jessie De'ath

Vera was born at Gislingham to Robert and Bessie Cook, the third child in a family of nine. She married Grimwood, a farmworker, and lived in Gislingham until he developed multiple sclerosis in his early 40's and was unable to work. They mover to Wash Lane, Mendlesham, in 1960. Their only son Roy was diagnosed with a brain tumour at the age of 6 and died when he was 21. They had one daughter, Rita. Vera and Grimwood were the first residents to move into Mason Court in 1976. After Grimwood's death in 2002 Vera continued to live there until she broke her femur, and then moved into Chilton Meadows, Stowmarket, for the last five years of her life. As well as her daughter Rita, she leaves a son-in-law, 2 grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren.

### Dog owners:

Please note this is an offence and comes with a £1,000 fine but more importantly is extremely upsetting to residents as well as being a health risk due to toxocariasis. **Responsible dog owners only please.**

### War Memorials:

Not for the first time, a long standing resident recently asked why Mendlesham does not have a war memorial for those lost from Mendlesham parish?

This question was also asked when we were working on the project for the USA memorial, now located in the grounds of St Mary's.

There is a memorial window, plaques and details in St Mary's Mendlesham but our parish

"memorial" does not take the traditional form.

With many thanks to Pris Colchester, this history has been documented and can be found in detail in the corridor near the bar in Mendlesham Community Centre. However in summary:

1919- a special committee was set up for the purpose of providing a Nurse for the Parish as a War Memorial. (This provision continued until the 1950's)

1954 - after the formation of the NHS it was agreed the need to provide a nurse was no longer required.

1955- it was agreed a playingfield would be provided as a War Memorial.

After lots of hard work and negotiations to acquire the land plus works to plough, level and reseed the land, the Mendlesham Memorial Playingfield land was purchased in 1960 . This includes the land with the children's play equipment, tennis courts and old Sunday football pitch now all in the ownership of Mendlesham Memorial Playingfields Charity for which Mendlesham Parish Council is sole trustee.

Please be aware the brick walls near the double ornate black iron gates have recently and on two separate occasions, been damaged by vehicles which may not be considered fitting for a war memorial site. We have discussed this as a Parish Council and have decided in view of future works anticipated on the land, at present we will not reinstate the walls as they may only be damaged again. As soon as we can, we will try to improve this area either by repairing/replacing the brick walls or perhaps coming up with an alternative solution fitting for a war memorial?

### 1<sup>st</sup> Mendlesham Cub Pack



If you were a Cub Scout you may remember the excitement and the adventure of doing something new. 1st Mendlesham still believes in that excitement and adventure...

Cub Scouts are boys and girls aged 8 to 10  $\frac{1}{2}$  years old and are the second youngest members of our Scout Group following on from Beavers (aged 6 to 8 years). Their activities include playing games, keeping fit, being creative, finding out about others; their culture and beliefs, as well as being involved with their local community. They also have the opportunity to go on trips, days out, and on camps. We believe that personal development rather than meeting set standards is the key attribute to their development and can be seen by the wide variety of badges Cubs can earn. At this age Cubs start to develop Leadership qualities and may become Sixers and Seconders in charge of a Six, which, as the name implies, is a group of six Cubs.

Cubs originally started in 1916 when boys who were too young to join Scouts at 11 became Wolf Cubs. They adopted the theme of the Jungle Book by Rudyard Kipling with the boys representing Mowgli's cubs and their leaders being known by the major characters; Akela, Baloo, Bagheera, Shere Khan and others. Each meeting started and ended with a Grand Howl, a ceremony still present today.

In 1966, Wolf Cubs became Cubs and the Section adopted the same salute as the Scouts and a similar promise. Cubs celebrated their golden jubilee and a new uniform and progressive training scheme of Bronze, Silver and Gold Arrow awards was implemented. Do you remember the caps, shorts and grey socks with green tabs?

This was immediately followed by major changes. Although women have been Cub Leaders since Cubs started, girls were only allowed to join the Venture Scout Units (16 to 18 years). Today there is still that lingering distinction of "Boy Scouts" and "Girl Guides". In fact, the word "boy" was dropped from the association's name in 1967 to become "The Scout Association".

In 1991 the Scout Association became fully co-educational, allowing girls to join all Sections. It was many years after this that our first girl joined as a Cub Scout. Although interest by girls has been limited, those that do join us come for the adventurous activities.

Changes came in 2001 with a new uniform of sweatshirts and activity trousers, in 2002 with a refreshed programme and in 2003 an enhanced, modular adult training scheme.

In 2016, our Cub Scouts celebrated *Cubs100*, their 100<sup>th</sup> birthday, taking part in special programmes and camps.

Chris Goodrum is our Cub Scout Leader and really needs a female leader if he is to look after our girls properly, especially on camps. Opportunities are available for any adult that is interested. If you have any questions, please phone me.





### 'A Time to Say Goodbye!'

There is a wonderful section in the Book of Ecclesiastes that says: 'There is a time for everything under Heaven'. Given that my retirement has been put back twice, I am extremely grateful to those who have expressed surprise at my age! But retire I must, and, within the United Reformed Church, there is the requirement to move away from the pastorates to which a minister has served – hence our return to West Yorkshire.

We leave with hearts that are heavy, knowing we have made many dear friends in our time 'down South' who have blessed, sustained, encouraged, supported and cared for us as a family, and enabled us to serve the Lord faithfully and obediently in our time among you. We take with us many wonderful memories that will sustain us as we venture 'From the old to the new'.

We can say without a shadow of doubt that we have been extremely happy living amongst you, and have considered it a great honour and privilege to have been given this time to live among you all. We hope that we have managed to repay your trust and goodwill by living 'The best life that we have been able' – all to the greater glory and praise of our God.

Many of you will know that I have a great passion for all things that are Celtic. Let me leave you with one of my favourite blessings:

'May the road rise up to meet you.

May the wind be always at your back.

May the sun shine warm upon your face;

The rains fall soft upon your fields

And until we meet again, may God hold you in the palm of His hand.

From the bottom of our hearts, we want to say a big THANK YOU for walking with us on this part of our journey of faith and service.



### Fr Philip Writes...


November is a month of prayer for the dead, hence we have a number of Requiems in our calendar of prayer. At St Mary's we pray for the dead in Christ and all the dead whose faith is

known to God alone. Very few of us are ready for the intense joys of heaven at the moment of death and so we are prepared for them in a state of enlightenment, growth and purification between earth and heaven which we call 'Paradise'.

After his death on the cross, Jesus went into that state and preached the good news to those who had no opportunity of hearing him on earth. In the old version of the Apostles Creed were the rather misleading words, "He descended into hell," which thankfully have now been revised to: "He descended to the dead." In the Bible, 1 Peter 3 v 19 gives support to this belief,

which was the fulfilment of Jesus' promise to the thief on the Cross: "Today you will be with me in Paradise." (Luke 23 v 43)

Paradise is a word for God's garden of rest. It does not mean the same as Heaven, to which Jesus ascended 42 days after his death on the cross. Jesus promised the penitent thief that he would not leave him when he passed into Paradise, that state of preparation for Heaven which his belated act of faith had opened to him. One term for this state is commonly known



as Purgatory, associated with the cleansing of a soul from the tendency to sin, but unfortunately the word has a lot of negative baggage associated with it from the Middle Ages. A more positive way is to see it as a state of ever-increasing light and peace. Hence we pray for those who have died: 'Rest eternal grant unto them, O Lord, And let light perpetual shine upon them.'

Some people think this state is painful and others that it is joyful. Both are true. Let us consider a convalescent home. It can be seen as an alarming place where unpleasant medicines and painful physiotherapy is given, but on the other hand it is a happy place as each day a patient is becoming stronger and getting better. The Church has always prayed for its departed members. In pre-Christian days Judas Maccabeus believed that prayer and sacrifice could benefit the dead. (2 Maccabees 12 v 43-44)

'Judas [Maccabeus]... having seen the effects of the sin of those who had fallen; after this he took a collection from them individually, amounting to nearly two



thousand drachmae, and sent it to Jerusalem to have a sacrifice for sin offered, an altogether fine and noble action, in which he took full account of the resurrection. For if he had not expected the fallen to rise again it would have been superfluous and foolish to pray for the dead.'

St Paul had similar beliefs (2 Timothy 1 v 18) 'May it be the Lord's will that he shall find mercy on that Day.'

There are lists on the table at the back of church for names to be read at various Requiems. Please visit the Holy Cross Chapel to pray for the departed that they may find light, rest and peace in God's kingdom of Heaven.
