



(in partnership with the United Reformed Church)

The above Club is run by a small group of volunteers and has been operating for around 5 years. It is open to all who would benefit from the company of others, irrespective of age, situation, location, faith (or none!). Every Monday morning we meet at Stowmarket URC Hall, 10.30 - 12.30pm, for a chat, refreshments, participate in board games/cards (if you so wish). Just, generally to socialize and make new friends. Attendance varies but, of late, we have been enjoying the company of 25-30 local people weekly. It is free, with a jar for voluntary donation to help costs, if you wish.

Trips out are also popular and these are arranged at minimal charges: Bressingham Gardens; Lowestoft; Theatre Royal BSE, recently. A teadance was arranged in August, with another scheduled for November. The Group has an excellent relationship with Stowmarket Town Council and certain other local charitable organisations. (eg. Lions Club, who help with Christmas transport etc.) Occasionally the Group has a fund-raising event: the next being a Coffee Morning at the URC hall in Stowmarket on Saturday 24th. November, from 10am.

Although events throughout the year are most enjoyable, JAM's highlight is undoubtedly Christmas Day. We are one big family of over 100 people! If you are an individual, or couple, who would otherwise be on your own and fancy being part of our JAM family on this special day - you are welcome. There is NO CHARGE; all we want is for you to enjoy a traditional 3 course lunch, the entertainment and company. Transport to Stow and back home to local villages can be sorted, if that is a problem. Many friends help us on the day and we have never turned anyone away (even if the odd unexpected guest arrives at lunchtime!)



#### 1<sup>st</sup> Mendlesham Scout Group



Last month I wrote about the successes of our Beaver Colony; recruiting two Beaver Leaders and the growing Colony membership. Later in this article you can read about our plans for the new Scout Headquarters in Mendlesham Green. Due to unforeseen events over the earlier part of this year, this project was delayed.

Several Groups in this District struggled to recruit adults to keep their Sections going. 1st Bacton had already closed their Cub Pack and were about to lose their Scout Leader. Our own failure to recruit meant that our Colony was due to close at Easter. The District Team decided that 1<sup>st</sup> Mendlesham should merge with 1<sup>st</sup> Bacton. Not having our own HQ we were to move everything to Bacton.1

My Leaders and I fought hard to prevent this from happening and compromises were reached. Bacton Beavers will continue to meet in Bacton's HQ but move on to our Pack when of age. Bacton Scouts moved across to join our Troop, retaining their Group Scarf and forming their own Patrol. And I have become Bacton's Group Scout Leader being the only GSL in the District to look after two Scout Groups! Given time and when I have made more progress with our building project I aim to rebuild Bacton to a fully working Scout Group. My thanks go to my Leaders for their support in this.

Over the summer and through the hot weather, our young people have enjoyed meeting outdoors on the site of the old Scout HQ in Mendlesham Green. The Parish Council gave us permission to put up a Mess Tent in case the weather turned inclement. This has allowed us to be in contact with our roots and to complete much of the 'outdoor' programme - Fire Lighting and Backwoods Cooking being popular activities with all ages. Again, my thanks go to the Parish Council for their support.

Planning permission has been obtained for a new building which will match the farm buildings around us. The building is steel framed and clad and will be fifty percent larger than the old wooden hut. There will be car parking for more cars, keeping parked vehicles away from the junction. Mid-Suffolk has recommended that the site be landscaped, possibly with fruit trees, to screen the building.

When you read this, several grant applications will have been submitted to raise the necessary £130,000 to complete the project. So far we have about £14,000, enough to build the foundations. £60,000 is required to supply and erect the building. The rest is needed for internal partitions, heating, lighting, decoration and landscaping. Although we have time against us, I am confident that we will raise the bulk of this money to start the project before planning permission expires.

On a down note, I have been told that some people are walking their dogs on the grass and leaving their droppings behind, evident by the soiled footwear of our members. As children are now regularly using the site for their Scouting activities could I ask for dog-owners to refrain from exercising their dogs on the site. Your support in this is much appreciated.

November 2019, next year, 1<sup>st</sup> Mendlesham Scout Group is 90 years old! We aim to party to celebrate this event. Watch out for more details.

This month, we say goodbye to our Minister, the Rev'd Chris Wood who is retiring and returning to live in Yorkshire. We wish Chris and Jayne a long and happy retirement.

#### No-one can Serve Two Masters!' (Matthew 6: 24)

One of the funniest plays I remember seeing was entitled 'The Servant of

Two Masters'. It was based on an Italian Classic farce from the 19<sup>th</sup> Century (translated into English!), where the key character is the exceptionally quirky and comical servant, who is constantly complaining of an empty stomach. He satisfy his hunger he keeps finding ingenious ways to satisfy his cravings, and then consuming everything and anything in sight. As my mother would remark: 'His eyes were bigger than his belly'.

The servant offers his time and resources to a young rich gentleman traveller (actually a woman in disguise – but that's another sub-plot in the play), and fulfils his responsibilities to his master reasonably well, but more so if there is an advantage to his aching stomach. All seems to be progressing reasonably well, until the opportunity presents itself that enables him to take on the extra role of being a servant to another wealthy traveller – hence 'The Servant of Two Masters'. He sees this as an opportunity to increase his food intake, but inevitably gets himself into all manner of scrapes, thus creating a farce of side-splitting proportions Inevitably the servant's main problem is how to satisfy the orders of two masters, as each makes constant demands both at the same time and with the expectation of instant attention.

This is then complicated by other characters appearing on stage and discretely handing him letters, money, instructions etc. with the words "This is for your master" without specifying which one.

Just as you think that matters couldn't get any worse, the servant discovers his two masters are staying in the same hotel, and are in fact, searching for each other, although he is busy trying to keep them apart. The most famous set-piece of the play is the scene in which the starving servant tries to preside over a banquet for his masters and their guests with both groups on different parts of the stage. He tries to juggle with food presentations and drinks without arousing the suspicions of the other, while desperately trying to satisfy his own hunger. Increasingly he moves around the stage in ever decreasing circles, although fulfilling most tasks with impeccable timing. It comes as no surprise that he's eventually found out when everything collapses around him – he could only keep up the pretence for so long – but the 'masters' are reconciled, and, in the process, he is forgiven.

For me the play highlights an incredible truth that is there both in the Old Testament as well as in the Gospel teaching. Early on we discover God saying through the Prophet Moses: 'You shall have no other gods but Me' *(Exodus 20:2 and Deuteronomy 5:6)* thus establishing the special relationship between a chosen people and their God. Jesus was only too aware of this truth when He warned that: 'No one can serve two masters; for either they will hate the first and love the second, or they will be devoted to the first and despise the second. You cannot serve God and Money' *(Matthew 6: 24).* Clearly, in this case, He wanted to warn against the striving for wealth and financial reward at the expense of our inner well-being.

But Jesus also broadens this challenge when He put a question to His twelve followers at a time when many were abandoning Jesus because of the demands of discipleship. Peter affirmed his faith and trust when asked to make a choice, by declaring 'Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life, and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God' (*John 6: 68 – 69*). Peter makes a commitment to have only one Master, and that is Jesus Christ his Lord and Saviour.

We know the responsibility is ours too – we are faced with the same challenge, and must make our stand, knowing we are encouraged to do the right thing in God's eyes and serve Him alone. We are left in no doubt that this is a tall order – but the benefits are out of this world!

'If a man who was rich enough in this world's goods saw that one of his brothers was in need, but closed his heart to him, how could the love of


God be living in him? My children, our love is not to be just words or mere talk, but something real and active' (1 John 3 v 17-19)
