### Parish Council: Mendlesham Playingfields.

At the time of writing, Mendlesham Parish Council has just issued two tenders for improvements and new works for Mendlesham Playingfields. This is:

- 1. To rejuvenate the existing Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) and associated ancillary works, including lighting and fencing. There will also be two external table tennis tables as part of this project.
- 2. To provide a plaza style concrete Wheeled Sports Area.

The location of these works will be as the existing tennis courts area with the wheeled area between what will be the MUGA and the rest of the playingfields. We will demolish the existing tennis court area ourselves so will be asking for volunteers to help in due course.

You may recall that as part of the new Station Fields development, developer S106 contribution was agreed, of some £154k, which is specifically dedicated to the Mendlesham Playingfields/ Community Centre site.

These works are intended to be Phase 1 of a project to spend this money and other developer monies allocated to Mendlesham, further your views from our consultation some eighteen months ago about how to spend developer contributions as well as our consultation of some three years ago, specifically with regard to what you wanted to see as facilities for this site.

The wheeled sports area will be an area which can be used by bicycle, scooters and skate board users.

The Muga will provide facilities for five a side football with recessed goals, basketball and competitive netball.

So, please do not be concerned, if over the next few weeks you see people visiting the site.

Once we have the tenders back, design and contractor(s) approved, hopefully at our Parish Council meeting of 7th August, we will then have to apply for the funds from MSDC and make a planning application to move the light posts to each corner rather than the existing lights more towards the middle of the Muga. These lights are planned to be LED lights and will be less intrusive than the existing. We hope that work will start Autumn 19/Spring 2020.


Once these works are completed, we will then commence work on Phase 2 of the project which is hoped to include a Street Gym, Junior Play area, fitness equipment and seating.

Phase 3 has been lightly discussed as perhaps ancillary facilities to include changing rooms, toilets and car park extension/overflow area. However, final decisions and budgets for this are still some time away.

### OBITUARIES HILARY FENNING

The youngest of 5 children of Russell and Ella Fenning, Hilary, known by her family as 'Hilly', was diagnosed as having Down's Syndrome when aged a few weeks old. She was born in 1955 at White House Farm and spent her first few years there before becoming a resident at Little Plumstead hospital. In the 1990's she moved to Brooke House, Framingham Earl, where staff cared for her with love and compassion and frequently took her on outings, which she loved. Although unable to communicate verbally, Hilly had powerful ways of showing her character and preference for different types of food and enjoyed music and activities. Fr Philip writes: "It was appropriate to have the Gospel about home as her remains were buried. Hilly had come home. Although I never knew her I believe that, just as the humblest little pool in a woodland reflects some of the glory of the sky, her life, no matter how insignificant it might have appeared in the eyes of the world, brought down to those around her a little bit of heaven."

### **RICHARD (DICK) HAILS**

Dick was born in 1947 in the family home, Shingle House, Mendlesham Green, the only son of Wilfred and Minnie Hails. By the time he was born, his parents were already caring for his cousin Brian, whose mother had died, so they were raised as brothers. Dick attended Hillcroft school in Stowmarket before Mendlesham Primary and Stowmarket Modern. After leaving school he was an apprentice at Thurlow's in Stowmarket as an agricultural engineer and went on to work at Mid Suffolk Growers, Needham Chalks, Sykes Pumps and Taylor Barnard. Throughout his life he was a motorbike enthusiast. He married Patricia (Trish) in 1971 at St Augustine's Ipswich and they lived for 10 years in Stowmarket where Dawn and Jonathan were born. In 1981 the family moved back into the family home at Mendlesham Green and in 1979 Dick started his own business, "Richard Hails Engineering" now continued by Jonathan. In later years he enjoyed gardening and spending time with his four grandchildren. For many years he was on Mendlesham Parish Council and a Trustee of the Town Estate Charity. He was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukaemia early this year and his health deteriorated quickly. Fr Philip conducted his funeral on 28<sup>th</sup> June at West Suffolk Crematorium.

### Reasonably priced transport in your community

BSEVC Connecting Communities provides reasonably priced transport for those wishing to travel, and who for whatever reasons are unable to access public transport near their homes. Often in more rural locations public transport is so infrequent that it is not possible to get to and from appointments, work or schools at the necessary times, or where there are bus stops and train stations they may not be within the passenger's walking capacity.

Our chief aims are to prevent people from becoming isolated in their homes and to offer them the opportunity to be independent, not totally reliant on their families and friends.

We have three fully accessible vehicles which cover, Mid Suffolk. We also operate a community car service. Most of the cars used are owner drivers. We are totally reliant on volunteer drivers to keep our services running.

Fares for the fully accessible vehicles are 1-5 miles  $\pounds$ 2.40, 6-9 miles  $\pounds$ 3.30, 10-14 miles  $\pounds$ 4.20.

The Community Car Service is charged differently at 54p per mile (inc VAT) and  $\pounds$ 1.20 booking fee for a single journey (also inc VAT).

To book journeys just give us a ring and we will take you through a quick registration process and then take details of your travel requirements.

We urgently need VOLUNTEER DRIVERS to keep our much valued services operating.

With more volunteer drivers we can take more passengers to hospital appointments, clinical appointments, day centres, social clubs, shopping, and visiting relatives and friends. We have a number of care home and shop staff who rely on us to get them to and from work. We also have passengers who use us regularly to get to pick up points for public transport.

We know from passengers' comments that they are very grateful for the services we provide and for us and our volunteers this is very rewarding and satisfying.

Francesca, based in our Stowmarket office will be so grateful to hear from any prospective volunteers and will be able to give you all the information you need to apply to join us.


The Street Fayre costs about £5k to put on. Money raised supports community events and organisations.

#### Fr Philip Writes...

August is the month of our Patronal Festival – the Assumption of Our Lady – and it is closely associated with the message of Easter. The Good News of

Easter is that Jesus has triumphed over sin and evil and so will we if we open our hearts to his Easter Power. **The Good News** is that every 'Good Friday' in our lives can be turned into an 'Easter Sunday' and that nothing can defeat us any more – not pain, sorrow nor even death. The **Good News** of Easter is that Jesus will work a miracle in our lives today if we open ourselves to his Easter power. The disciples believed again after despairing; they loved after hating. The power of Easter continues to work miracles in people's lives wherever it is preached and wherever people open themselves to it.

Mary was the first to respond to the **Good News** when she said 'YES' to Gabriel so that God could become flesh from her flesh. When she received the Word of God she set out to share the Good News with her cousin Elizabeth. Mary is the first human being to bring the



**Good News** of Jesus to someone else and she does it simply by carrying Christ within her. The Assumption of Mary is one of the oldest



celebrations in the Church. Mary, the one who bore in her womb the Messiah – God made Man – has not been left to return to dust, but is in



heaven body and soul. She is now what we will be in due course.

What is this feast saying to us? It says that we, too, are called, body and soul to glory. Mary's glory in heaven pledges that Christ brings everlasting life to all who put their hopes in him. This celebration is Mary's Easter. She is the woman of our harvesttime, when the earth is laden with golden corn and ripe fruit is waiting to be gathered in. The Assumption reveals the importance of the body, as the whole person is called to participate in the mystery of salvation. It is a reminder that we will one day die and stand before Jesus, the first judge **(2 Timothy 4 v 8).** Are we ready to meet Jesus

now? Do we pray for a happy death? This feast calls us to prepare with hope and confidence in God's mercy for the moment of our death.
