Parish Council: Planning application

Have you subscribed to E News, if not we would strongly recommend that you do so via the Mendlesham website, as this is sometimes the only way to advise yourselves of current news for Mendlesham.

For example at the time of writing, we have just received notification that the recent hybrid planning application for 63 houses on Land North East of Chapel Road, Mendlesham has now been changed to outline permission for up to 49 dwellings. After representation to MSDC, this application is open again for consultation - see revised documents submitted 23.7.19.

At the time of writing we are trying to arrange a Parish Council extraordinary meeting to discuss this application. This meeting is likely to have to occur before the next paper newsletter is published, as MSDC have provided a deadline of 30th August for consultation comments. Whilst the agenda will be published on the Parish Noticeboards outside the Old School Room, Mendlesham and at the old Scout Hut site at Mendlesham Green, we can publish agendas up to three three working days in advance of a meeting and in the majority of times, do this to allow for unanticipated agenda items to be included as required.

Obituaries Colin Skilling

Fr Philip officiated at Seven Hills Crematorium for the funeral of Colin Skilling on 26th July. Colin, who had 4 brothers and 1 sister, was born in London, where he married Janice in 1974 and moved to Mendlesham in 1979. They had 3 children, Wendy, Cindy and David, 4 grandchildren and a great grandson. Colin belonged to the Mendlesham Bowls Club, was an early treasurer for the Mendlesham Community Council and Captain of the Fleece Darts Team. He was a carpenter and site manager for a construction firm, working for Hilton's Construction at its head office in Colchester until he was 59, when he retired. He loved going abroad, especially to Greece and had a boat on the Norfolk Broads at Burgh St Peter. He had suffered from Muscular Dystrophy for some time, but his last illness was very sudden and he died in Ipswich hospital on 1st July.


Mildred (Milly) Driver

Milly was born at Framsden, the middle one of 3 children. She went to school in Helmingham and afterwards stayed at home to care for her mother. She then went into service at Debenham. She met her husband Jack and they married at Framsden church then moved to Crows Hall Debenham, where their two children, Dawn and Neville were born. In 1960 they moved to Memorial Farm, Mendlesham, on the Norwich Road (A140) which Jack farmed. After he died in 1995 Millie moved to Chapel Road to be closer to Dawn. She was a shy, reserved person who loved her garden and her family. She died at her home on 8th July and was buried in the churchyard after a funeral in St Mary's church on 23rd July.

Parish Council: 50 50 shop vandalism

It is really disappointing to report that further to incidents earlier in the year, resulting in a window for the footballers store needing to be boarded up following damage to the then glass window, the same has now happened to the 50 50 shop window.

Thank you to the volunteers who boarded up the windows so quickly. These incidents have been reported to the Police and requests made for increased patrols. Please remember if you see such incidents, if they are happening at the time, please report it to the Police via 999, if it has already happened via 101. We need to help the Police to identify those responsible and stop this mindless behaviour which is costing public money and resources. There are far more important matters we should be dealing with.



Parish Council: Mendlesham Playingfields: Muga and Wheeled Sports areas

At the time of writing, our two tenders to provide a Multi Sports Games Area (MUGA) and Wheeled Sports Area (WSA) have just closed. An application is in the process of being made to MSDC for part of the S106 Developer monies contributed as part of the new Station Fields Development and specifically allocated to Mendlesham Community Centre/ Playing Fields site.

As soon as confirmation of funding is received, preferred contractors will be appointed and you will see works commence on site. Initially, surrounding hedging and trees will need to be removed between the carpark and tennis courts to allow access for the works. This is unavoidable but landscaping will be reinstated once all works are completed. Then the existing fencing and block walls will be removed. Whilst the vegetation will be removed by a professional contractor, it is hoped to save costs, much of the other demolition work can be undertaken by volunteers. Thank you to those who have already volunteered. If you are able to help us, please contact the Parish Clerk at <u>parishclerk@mendleshampc.org</u> or tel 01449 766139.

During these works and may be even before School returns, it is likely that the car parking areas will need to be reduced to enable works to be carried out safely. We apologise in advance for this inconvenience but would hope that those who can, will walk or cycle to School/Community Centre/Playing Fields.

However, this document, once completed, will be one of the main planning documents for development in our district and parish for many years to come, not just for housing, but also many subjects which will make the place we live and work, what it is.



Psalm 107:27 They reel to and fro, and stagger like a drunken man, and are at their wits' end. (KJV)

When I was at work (seems a long time ago now), on my office wall was the sign "When you come to the end of your tether tie a knot and hang on". How often have you felt that you are at the end of your tether or at your wits' end? It is probably something we have said, or thought, at one time or another when things have become overwhelming. Being at one's wits' end is defined in the Cambridge Dictionary as "being so worried, confused or annoyed that you don't know what to do next" – no humour/ shrewdness/ cleverness left.

Before the school holidays there were teachers at their wits' end waiting, following marking overload, for the holidays to come so they could recharge their batteries ready for a new year. For the youngsters during those 6 weeks off from school being at home may have led to some being bored and not knowing what to do with themselves. As we come to the last few days of the holidays many parents may be at their wits' end as to what to do with their offspring having used up all their ideas.

With dwindling numbers and an ageing congregation in many of our churches and chapels we may be at our wits' end trying to find a way to get our message across in the hope that people will return to our congregations and fill up those empty seats.

Psalm 107 gives a very quick resume of the history of Israel where time and time again they turned away from God and tried to do things their own way only to find themselves at their wits' end not knowing what to do or which way to turn. Each time when they finally turned to God, he pointed them in the right direction.

Sometimes, in our own lives, we can be so overcome by our situation or the way our life is going that we don't know what to do. There are even times when we put ourselves in situations that we can't, by ourselves, get out of. When we are at our wits' end can be the place where we find God waiting for us. A time to tie a knot in our tether and listen to the word of God. And often God will come to us in the form of a friend who picks you up when you are down or who listens to you and helps you to move on.

May you know the peace of God this September.



Fr Philip Writes...

Again and again over the years I have heard people criticize the Church in this way: "Why doesn't the Church speak out?" It is so easy for

people to point a finger at bishops and priests but fail to look at themselves. Spreading the Good News of the Kingdom cannot be achieved in God's Church by leaders alone, but only when laity (those who

ordained) work are not together with them. In the Gospels we read how Jesus sent out not onlv the 12 ordained i.e. the apostles: (Luke 9 v 1-6) but also the 72 others - i.e. the laity (Luke 10 v 1-20). The



numbers 12 and 72 add to make 84, which in the Bible signifies completeness and perfection, since it is the product of 7 and 12, both special numbers indicating spiritual perfection.



The building of God's Kingdom must be done by priests and laity together. In the Eastern Orthodox churches, the priest is known as the 'Ikon of Jesus Christ' – the living personification of him – not meaning the priest's character, since all fall very short of Jesus' character, but his function in presiding over the Mass, proclaiming

God's Word, administering the Sacraments and leading prayer etc. But the priest cannot proclaim the Kingdom without the laity. St Mark tells us *'Jesus could not work many miracles there.'* (*Mark 6 v 5*) Where? In his home village of Nazareth - because people failed to believe he was capable of doing any miracles because of their antagonism, jealousy, indifference and refusal to co-operate.

The words of Fr Arthur Stanton, that famous Anglo-Catholic priest of St Alban's Holborn, have been my aim during my 50 years as a priest. He said,

"This is what I should like to be said of me when I am dead and gone the way of all flesh, 'He preached Jesus'."

I hope I have preached Jesus and continue to do when I preside at Mass, preach God's Word and do all other priestly duties.



You, as laity are also called to live the Christian life. Hans-Reudi Weber wrote the following words in *'Salty Christians'*:

"Too often clergy undertake to fulfil by themselves the ministry of the church. All too often the laity delegate their ministry to one man – the clergyman. This 'one-man show' is deeply unbiblical. Christ does not grant special gifts only to men and women who are full time, lifetime employees of the Church. All the people of God share in Christ's ministry to the world. Of course, the clergyman is chosen by God for certain important functions in the Church, and for these functions he is 'ordained'. One of these important functions is to nourish, equip, help and sustain the laity for their ministry."



Bishop Philip North writes in 'Together', the voice of Catholic Anglicans: "In Mark 3:14 Jesus calls the disciples to be with him and to be sent out. It's as simple as that. On the one hand they are to be with him in prayer,

worship and

teaching and in the very same action they are to be sent out to share the Good News of the Kingdom."

If you can fulfil that as laity and I do as your priest, we shall have the perfect balance for reaching out to others (72 +12 =84).
