Parish Council: Remembrance events:

Thank you to everyone who worked so hard to organise our Remembrance events this year. It was a rollercoaster experience, not only undertaking the "normal" tasks such as ordering and arranging who would lay wreaths, sorting candles, flags and the church service arrangements in accordance with Covid 19 regulations, to then have to make difficult and unwanted decisions very quickly once National Lockdown was announced, cancel the existing arrangements and then plan for what was safe and possible.

Mendlesham is extremely fortunate in that with lots of commitment and hard work by several people, a service was held, although without a congregation, streamed live (a first for Mendlesham), candles lit for each of the 35 Mendlesham men who gave their lives in WW1, WW2 and the Korean War and the 288 USAAF Servicemen who gave their lives whilst stationed at the Mendlesham Airfield in WW2, and wreaths laid both inside St Marys for the British and outside at the Memorial to the USSAF 34th Bomb Group where the flags also flew. The flags were also put up on the 11th.

So a very poignant, but no less meaningful event- just different.

Particular thanks to Father Philip, Anne and Andrew for representing Mendlesham with such dignity and respect. If you were unable to watch on the day, have a look at

Parish Council: Mendlesham Memorial Playingfields :

MUGA (Multi Use Games area) and WSA (Wheel Sports Area)

Please would everyone be aware, including parents and carers of our younger residents that our two new exciting parish assets, the MUGA and WSA are not yet open for public use. Whilst we appreciate how wonderful they look, the project work is not yet completed and the appropriate safety measures are still to be completed.

CCTV is now in operation covering the area, so any persons acting irresponsibly and entering the area via the security fencing, could be identified and reported to the Police accordingly. However we really hope that this will not be required as the Police have better things to do at present and we hope all parents will keep their children safe.

We have already started to formulate plans to have the WSA painted by the potential users before opening, to encourage ownership of the area and deter anti social behaviour. However all of these plans are currently on hold whilst we are in lockdown and at present it is not possible to provide any completion/opening dates. We do understand how frustrating this is, but these areas will be opened as soon as we can do so safely when the project is completed.

Tower Multi Play unit

Shortly, the tunnel bridge part of the Multi Play Tower unit will be removed by contractors. The unit will still be safe to use and the tunnel will be returned suitably refurbished as soon as possible thereafter.

The bridge is currently safe to use, but is in need of some maintenance to keep it safe for the future. My County – Silly Suffolk (By Walter Tye (1881 – 1979)

Part One of Four

"Breathes these a man with soul so dead, who never to himself hath said, This is my own, my native life"

I have always been proud of my county and its people. Even as a schoolboy in Mendlesham, I had a feeling that the so-called "Silly Suffolk" had something special and attractive about it. That feeling has stayed with me ever since, and increasingly so with the years. Much travel and long experience have not changed my opinion. The further removed, the heavier the chains that bind. It is much to be hoped that "overspills" and "blowers-in", with their consequent effects, will not detract unduly from Suffolk's quiet scenery, or obliterate the qualities and manner of speech of the older inhabitants. The "sing-song" tone and clipped consonants of the Old Suffolkers still ring in my ears.

At the outset, may I be excused for "clearing the air" as to the origin and implications of that long-standing epithet of "Silly Suffolk". On inquiry, I find the word "Silly" originally meant "blessed", and that it was applied to Suffolk as it had more churches comparatively than any other county in England.

The main characteristics and general way of life of the true Suffolker were largely determined by the county's geographical position. With the Waveney in the north, the Stour in the south and the impenetrable fens in the west, the inhabitants, that is, before the days of modern transport, were almost entirely cut off the rest of the country. The only entry by land was a Newmarket gap, then known as the "Devil's Dyke". In consequence, the easiest entry into East Anglia was by sea, and the broad estuaries of the Orwell, Gipping and the Waveney, Norse, Danes and Saxons took every advantage. It was the fear of invasion that was the responsible for the characteristics of those who chose and dared to settle near the coast. Even "Lords of the Manor" kept clear of that area. Hence the large number of freeholds that are found in East Anglia, as compared with places further inland. Anyhow, all credit is due to those early settlers who, despite constant invasions, choose to defend hearth and home at all costs.

Whatever Suffolk's reputation may have been in the past it can, without exaggeration, claim to be one of our leading counties in agriculture. Visits to the various agricultural shows over the years substantiate this. Moreover, who has not heard of Suffolk Barley and Breweries, it's red poll cows, magnificent Suffolk punches and black faced sheep. These could never have been, had it not been for Suffolk's high fertility of soil, coupled with intelligent breeding and good husbandry in general. No better soil can be found than that of "High Suffolk", and no better pastures and be seen than those lying alongside the banks of the Gipping, Alde, Waveney and Stour, that cattle for generations and raised in peace and satisfaction. This was all to the good in the olden days, when both farmer and cottagers were much dependent on their home-made bread, home brewed beer, home cured bacon and pork.



Here at Time For You we understand that when you've had a long week at work the last thing you want to do with your weekend is spend it cleaning up after everyone else.

We want to let you know some cleaning hints to make the cleaning a little easier to manage. **Sanitise** Top of the list at the moment, with the Coronavirus pandemic, is how to ensure your home remains safe and sanitised from any germs which may be lingering. Allowing fresh air to circulate is extremely important. Cleaning should include high touch points; light switches, door handles, toilet handles, remote controls and keyboards. Even if they are not visibly dirty, these places house the most unseen germs and bacteria. These areas should be cleaned daily, with a normal cleaning product and then a disinfectant over the top which is left to air dry.

Cleaning Top to Bottom This phrase came about for a good reason! Starting at the top and working down means any dirt or dust you dislodge does not fall on somewhere already cleaned. Apply the same rule to every room – start with cobwebs and work down to the floor. **Getting in the Zone** Break home cleaning into smaller tasks – spending an hour a day if a different zone is a great way to deep clean areas not normally covered in a general clean.

Cut the Clutter Those ornaments, book and magazine just get in the way so have a clear out and then make sure everything has a place.

Keep your cleaning caddy close by Having your cleaning kit to hand cuts down running up and down stairs every few minutes making the clean easier.

Sweet smell of success Make your home smell fresh as well as looking clean and tidy. Open the windows for some fresh air, sprinkle bicarbonate of soda in the bin or on carpets and leave overnight to absorb smells and use Citrus fruits like lemons and grapefruits are a fantastic way to keep your home clean, smelling nice and free of germs. Even the peels can be left in your rubbish bin to remove nasty smells and eventually used as kindling in your fireplace!





ADVENT AND CHRISTMASS



As I am writing this during the lockdown and do not know how the Government will advise about what we will be allowed to do at Christmass, please see the church website and the Mendlesham e-news newsletter for updates.



The World

There was no room for Jesus the night of his birth. Mary must have started her labour during the early evening. I imagine Joseph being a little nervous about the whole affair as they were alone. There do not have been seem to anv complications but nobody paid any attention for everyone was busy with other things. There was no cot, midwife, grandmother, sister or aunt in attendance. People were in Bethlehem for a census - not to be counted but for a registration of land

in view of a property tax to be paid. Joseph must have had property near Bethlehem. I imagine everything taking longer than expected owing to the bureaucratic attitudes of officialdom. They were probably no different from

officials the world over, liking to use the small amount of power given them by sending people from pillar to post. Jesus was born in the midst of the most hopelessly chaotic human affairs of land ownership, land registration and tax forms.



2. The Unorthodox

The first people to see God made Man were shepherds. We tend to picture them



as wise old men talking every day about the Messiah to come, studying the Old Testament, prophets and playing on their musical instruments. But they were 'ruffians' – outcasts of society and considered anti-social, untrustworthy and unorthodox and classed alongside taxcollectors and prostitutes. God's angels didn't go to the high priests, the king or the 'important' businessmen of the town but to these shepherds. We are told "the glory of the Lord shone around

them." They received the message and immediately rushed to find the child they had been told about while the rest of the world was busy, asleep or absent.

3. The Stranger

Jesus was a stranger in the world he had made. Maybe you feel God made Man is removed from this world of violence, wars, starvation and tragedy from coronavirus. Jesus is God made Man and he has experienced all kinds of violence, hardship and oppression. He was born in the midst of a world caught up in a financial crisis, bureaucracy and oppression. He knows exactly how it is to feel unwelcome and unwanted.

Maybe you are one of those people who feel "unorthodox" – not 'good enough' and 'a stranger' or 'outside' the church. Jesus was born for all of us and the Gospels lay special stress on those whom others might consider unorthodox. The shepherds were the first in this category, but they were the first Christian pilgrims: they received the message and left Jesus as changed men, glorifying God. If Christmass is to have any relevance and meaning to us, we need to respond as they did.



God calls you and me. What is our response?
