

All the shoeboxes stay local. They are taken to the night shelter in Ipswich and also distributed to the soup kitchens. Amy extra are taken to Bury and Norwich.

Next to Kent's, the Bakers, was the Post Office. It was run by two Miss Martins. One Miss Martin was tall and thin, but her sister was shorter and dumpy and she only had one arm. I think they lived in Mr Braybrooke's old house. One day my father helped the taller Miss Martin with something and she said that she wished he would come and live with her. My father duly reported this to my mother, who said "Well, why don't you?" to which he said perhaps he would. At this. I burst into tears and had to be reassured. The mail sorting was done in Mendlesham Post Office in those days and when I was older and an important letter had to catch the post, I sometimes had to tear along to the post office at the last minute, burst open the door and gasp out, "Has the post gone?" . I didn't like doing this.

Coming down Back Street and just before the Alley, was Mr Jackaman's shop. Mr Jackaman sold delicious custard ices, the only ice creams in the village then. Mrs Jackaman helped him in the shop. She was tall and thin and spoke in rather a brisk, prim way. I think Mr Jackaman had a shoe repairing business next door. In the middle of the road was a big work shed where Harry Dick kept planks of wood. I think he made coffins.

Of notable people in the village I can remember Sunshine who always dressed in a rusty looking black coats and hat and Wellington boots. I have an idea that her real name was Mrs Clements and that she had been very smart as a young woman.

These are the WWII childhood memories of Mary Joyscelyne (nee Hurrell), continuing from Part Five, and Parts One to Four in the previous edition of this Newsletter).

Mr and Mrs Mayfield lived in the house next to the Old School Room. Mr Mayfield was the previous headmaster. He had white hair and white moustache and was distinguished looking. Sometimes when their granddaughter Sylvia came to see them. I will be invited to go and play. They had a lovely garden with a Beauty of Bath tree. Mrs Mayfield would give us Beauty of Bath apples every year, which we had to eat immediately as they did not keep. They also had a big dressing up box because Mr Mayfield used to take part in amateur dramatics. This was full of cloaks and all sorts of interesting things which we were allowed to dress up in. I specially remember a big red cloak.

During the war the evacuees came to Mendlesham. Our evacuees came from a school in Dagenham, with three of their teachers, one of whom was called Mr Cohen. I remember seeing all the evacuees waiting patiently in front of the village hall, each with a brown paper carrier bag, while Mrs Pizzy and other members of the WVS arranged which families the children would go to. Our evacuee was called Doreen Stockwell. She was a bit older than I was. Her mother came to visit her once, but I don't know how long the evacuees stayed in the village.

At certain times of the year seasonal games would appear. I don't know who made the first move in bringing out each game. Girls would start skipping and playing hopscotch. Both girls and boys would play marbles. We called the coloured glass marbles "allies". I also had a very small marble that we called the "pipna". Girls would also play with two balls, three balls, even four balls, throwing them against the wall in rotation and catching them. I don't know whether children play these games now.

Parish Council: Mendlesham Playingfields MUGA and WSA project:

It is hoped very shortly that we will be able to open both of these new facilities for use.

Thank you to Ali Woodley, our project manager, who has managed this project on our behalf, including the unexpected delays and difficulties arising due to Covid.

There is still work to do with landscaping, seating and permanent signage and our new table tennis tables will not be in place until the Spring.

There are also many others to thank, hopefully at an official opening event in the Spring.

At our recent Parish Council meeting, it was reported that poppy selling would need to change this year with door to door sales and local outlets currently in question.

A highlight of the year was the visit of Mr Huggins, the chimney sweep, when he came to sweep our chimney. My mother got up early to make preparations. Anything movable was moved, big furniture was pushed back and all the furniture and carpets covered with dust sheets. Mr Huggins, very tall and thin, all in black, arrived on his bicycle with his brushes strapped behind. An annual treat for me was to run outside to watch for when the brush came out of the chimney and Mr Huggins would wiggle it well and make it go up and down so that we knew the chimney was well and truly swept. Afterwards, my father would give Mr Huggins a glass of whisky. As this was one of the rare times I remember seeing whisky in our house, it was surely an important occasion. Mr Huggins would then regale us with a few anecdotes. He described once how he had just finished sweeping the chimney in a big house locally, and the dust sheets had all been removed, when there was suddenly a great fall of soot, which went all over the room. "Oi hetta larf," said Mr Huggins.

Mr Huggins was also the school caretaker. Before Mr Huggins. I think Mrs Lewis was the caretaker. I am not sure who was in charge. On one occasion my father had forgotten to cancel the school milk because of the holiday. Mr Juby duly arrived with the crates of milk. "Yew duzzy owd fewl, yew", said Mr Huggins (or Mrs Lewis). I'm not sure what Mr Juby replied.

Since 1991 there has been a museum at Brockford recreating a representation of what the railway was like. We had an extremely successful open day on January 1st 2020 but unfortunately we have had to remain closed this season. However, we now have some good news which is we will be running

SANTA SPECIALS AT THE MID SUFFOLK LIGHT RAILWAY 6th, 13th & 20th December, 8 trains per day, first train 10.00

For a magical Christmas treat for children up to 10 years old, a trip on a Mid-Suffolk Light Railway Santa Special is not to be missed.

Steam trains run from Brockford Station to 'North Pole Halt', where the children will have an individual meeting with Santa at his Christmas Guards Van. The Stations, Brockford and 'North Pole Halt' will be fully decorated in full 'Christmasy' style.

Visitors can enjoy the unique atmosphere created at Suffolk's only standard gauge (full sized) award wining railway museum. The Santa Special's genuine Great Eastern Railway Victorian four wheeled coaches are a historical experience for any passengers, especially younger ones and there will also be other entertainment including a traction engine and model railway.

All seats must be booked in advance. To be Covid -19 safe, bookings will be by compartment with a minimum of £50.00 for four persons per compartment + £12.50 per additional passenger with a maximum of 6 passengers, or up to 8 if they are from the same household. We also have availability of up to 11 passengers in our first class compartment.

Trains run from 10.00 a.m. to 3.45 p.m. on 6th, 13th and 20th December. Passengers will be asked to arrive 15 minutes before their booked departure. We respectfully request visitors to be as punctual as possible due to the extra cleaning regime we have to operate to be Covid compliant and we ask all visitors to wear masks in and around the railway's public areas and to their train.

All seats will be padded, but there will be no blankets. Passengers may bring their own if required. Also due to coronavirus restrictions we are unable to provide any refreshments.

Bookings and compartments will be identified by a number and reindeer name (non-transferable). To book, or for more information, visit www. mslr.org.uk/Santa Specials or call 01449 766874 between 9.00a.m and 6.00p.m.. Bookings will commence Thursday 15th October.



Dear Friends

Remember, remember the fifth of November The Gunpowder treason and plotter. I see no reason why gunpowder treason Should ever be forgot.

The opening of this poem is one that we all remember from childhood, and it could be said that the first 2 words sum up the month of November, (Remember, remember), in the Christian calendar. It starts with All Saints Day on the 1st of November (mainly for Roman Catholics, Lutherans and Anglicans) and is a universal Christian Feast that honours and remembers all Christian saints, known and unknown.

On 2nd November, it is All Souls Day, the commemoration of all the faithful departed, (again, mainly for Roman Catholics, Lutherans and Anglicans).

Then, of course, there is bonfire night on the 5th of November, not a Christian Festival. In 1605, Guy Fawkes, also known as Guido, and a group of conspirators attempted to blow up the Houses of Parliament. After Queen Elizabeth I died in 1603, English Catholics who had been persecuted under her rule had hoped that her successor, James I, would be more tolerant of their religion. James I had, after all, had a Catholic mother. Unfortunately, James did not turn out to be more tolerant that Elizabeth and a number of young men, (13 to be exact) decided that violent action was the answer.

One of the group members even sent an anonymous letter warning his friend, Lord Monteagle, to stay away from Parliament on November 5th. The warning letter reached the King, and the King's forces made plans to stop the conspirators.

Guy Fawkes, who was in the cellar of the Parliament with the gunpowder when the authorities stormed it in the early hours of November 5th, was caught, tortured and

executed. On the very night that the Gunpowder Plot was foiled, on November 5th, 1605, bonfires were set alight to celebrate the safety of the King. Since then, that date has become known as Bonfire Night.

Then we have Remembrance Day and Remembrance Sunday when we, as a nation, remember the guns falling silent on the 11th day of the 11th month at 11 minutes past the 11th hour to mark the end of the First World War and all the wars after that right up to the present day. This year, we remember that it is 75 years since end of World War 2.

This year, perhaps, our remembering will be more poignant as we remember those we have lost with the Covid 19 pandemic (both those who are known to us and those we do not know) and how has changed the world.

And whilst we are remembering all of this, we also remember, as we do every Sunday and every day, the price Christ paid for us on the Cross. Keep remembering in the peace of God.

Fr Philip Writes

Jesus said, "There are many rooms in my Father's house."

By his Father's House, Jesus meant heaven. The Jews held a belief that in heaven there are different grades of blessedness – stages upon the way to glory. The hymn "Love Divine" expresses stages in these words, "Changed from glory into glory, 'til in heaven we take our place...." Speaking in earthly terms we sometimes feel we would be too dazzled with too



much splendour if, immediately on our death we were ushered into the very presence of God, and that we need to be cleansed and purified until we can face greater glory.

An earthly house can be overcrowded; an earthly inn must turn


away a traveller if the accommodation is exhausted. In God's house there is room for all, because heaven is as wide as the heart of God.

Many harbours are very difficult to approach. When great ships come in, a little pilot boat is sent out to guide them in. It goes before them and they follow it as it leads them through the channel into



safe waters. That is an illustration of what Jesus did. He showed the way to heaven for us to follow.

St Thomas found this difficult to understand. Jesus said, "I AM THE WAY." What did he mean? Just imagine you are in a strange town and ask for directions. A person may say: "1st right, 2nd left, go past the church and then 3rd left and 4th right." I imagine most of us would be lost before we got half way. But if that



person were to say, "Come with me, I'll take you there," we can't go wrong. That is what Jesus does, as he walks with us. He does not tell us which way to go, but is there alongside us, for he IS the way.

This month is dedicated as a month of prayer for the dead on their journey. They need purification; they need to grow and hence we sprinkle their graves with holy water as a sign of cleansing and growth. They need prayer; hence we use incense, which is a sign of

prayer: many grains burning together to form a single vapour. The vestments at Mass are black, which symbolises sin. We pray that the departed may receive complete healing of body, mind and spirit in God's kingdom.

I am often asked about people who seemed to have little or no faith in God. It is not for us to judge or jump to the



conclusion that God has rejected them. I have often found more faith in the most unexpected people. Jesus spoke of faith *"like a grain of mustard seed."* (Matt 17 v 20) It might be tiny at present but is capable of tremendous growth.



I believe we should be positive and optimistic rather than negative and defeatist, for God is just and merciful.

"God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through him might be saved." (John 3 v 17)
