We are extremely conscious that the Parish Council as Trustee of the Mendlesham Community Centre Charity, has not communicated with residents and regular hirers recently, further to the decision in principle to sell the charity owned parts of the Community Centre.

At the time of writing, this is because whilst there is a huge amount of work being undertaken, currently there is nothing definite to communicate or ask for your thoughts and help for.

As soon as possible, we will let you know about forthcoming works to the building, hire of the existing building to the community, sale and the exciting opportunity to build a new community facility.

We are aware that after such a long wait, things are likely to move very quickly so please sign up to E News via the Mendlesham website, watch the Parish Noticeboards and local Social Media. We will also provide an update in the next edition of this newsletter.

Parish Council:

Mendlesham Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) update:

The Parish Council has submitted our revised NDP to Mid Suffolk District Council (MSDC), MSDC has checked all our our NDP Paperwork (see https://mendlesham.suffolk.cloud/mendlesham-parish-council/neighbourhood-plan/july-2021/) and satisfied itself that it is both complete and complies with all of the relevant statutory requirements.

MSDC is now proceeding with the next stage in the process by commencing their Regulation 16 submission consultation which is sent to all statutory consultees (those organisations and bodies, defined by statute, which local planning authorities are legally required to consult before reaching a decision on relevant planning applications. The notice can also be sent to residents, local businesses and local interest groups.

At the end of the consultation MSDC will provide formal comments on the process which may lead to further adjustments being made to the NDP. Upon a satisfactory conclusion to the overall consultation process the reviewed NDP could then be put forward to a local referendum.

Proud to be in our Parish

The man behind the camera, the high flyer, the one you want to see in a health crisis, the person who gives you the needle - he lives here in our parish and we are proud of him: **Mike Favager.**

Mike and his wife Mo (a retired nurse) moved to Mendlesham in 2003. A 'scouser' from Liverpool whose career has taken him to Germany, Belize, Shropshire, Yorkshire and Hampshire before finding Suffolk said 'moving to Mendlesham was an accumulation of the right house in a lovely area at the right time of our lives'.

A military pilot for 26 years initially Mike trained as an Aircraft Engineer changing roles in the 1980's to become a helicopter pilot and then a helicopter flying instructor. On retirement from the army he worked in the Defence Helicopter Flying School training new Army, Navy and Airforce pilots. More recently he worked for Aviation Training International Ltd as Training Centre Manager for the Apache Flight Simulators. No wonder his calm, orderly approach to life made him just the man you want beside you as a Community First Responder. He completed his training in 2009 and now is a coordinator, trainer and assessor for other responders. If you would like to know more about this organisation and mav he volunteer https://www.eastamb.nhs.uk/join-the-team/community-first-responders But if that is not for you, familiarise yourself with the location of a Defibrillator outside the Community Centre/School and in the old telephone box at Mendlesham Green. You may be asked to fetch one!

Mike is often on call at weekends but you may meet him in a non-emergency situation and one of equal importance: a **Covid Vaccination Centre**. When the pandemic struck, as someone who, when faced with a problem, immediately wants to become part of a solution, thought 'How can I help?' and trained as a Vaccinator.

Using his skills as a communicator and understanding technology, in 2015 Mike set up a **Camera Club.** The club meets monthly in the Old School Room and, undeterred by the pandemic, has kept going using 'Zoom'. www.mendleshamcameraclub.co.uk.

So does this busy man have time for hobbies? Yes – wood turning! Working with the **Street Forge Workshop Ltd** in Thorndon Magnum (see Facebook page) alongside disabled adults. They make bird boxes and beautiful items which you can see for sale at Nutshell Cafe, Stowupland.

A simple service of prayer and praise followed, consisting of hymns, psalms and chance, which they knew so well, but of which they never tired. And so, it was that masters and men, mistresses and maidservants, worshipped together for one brief hour, forgetful, for the time being of the barriers that so often divided them. Alas: how soon forgotten. For the old idea that "God made us high and lowly, and ordered our estate" was far too engrained to be easily forgotten.

Mendlesham was fortunate in the 90s in having a broadminded and sympathetic Vicar, who made but little distinction between Anglicans and dissenters, regarding them all as part of his flock. Tall and priestly, with a voice like a bell, he could be both seen and heard the length of "The Street" when meeting the funeral court charged at the church gates. Of his many good qualities, tact was outstanding. The following incident will bear this out.

For some time, the Independents had doubts as to whether the vicar was really a "saved man" in accordance with their long-cherished tenets that "sudden conversion and confession of the same" were the main essentials of salvation. Hence their decision to call a special prayer meeting on behalf of the vicar. As in most villages, news like this soon spread, soon reaching the ears of the vicar. To everybody's surprise, particularly the dissenters, the vicar was in no way offended. On the contrary, he sent a message to the pastor saying how grateful he was for their kindly thought, and that he could do with all the prayers they cared to raise on his behalf. This so dumbfounded the Independents that boast Astor and Deacons decided to postpone the meeting, till they had given the matter further thought. Needless to say, no further doubts were expressed in the village as to the Vicar's qualifications as a Christian leader.

Various methods were tried out by the villagers when seeking "charities" from the vicar. For advice, they often approach the Sexton, the liaison officer. One old villager, known as the cadger, did very well for a time, but was eventually turned down by the vicar, whose patients was last exhausted. "Go to church regularly", commented the Sexton and ask again. But the vicar remained adamant. As a last chance the wily old Sexton said, "Well, bad, all I can say now is, you'd better try the early service".

Both chapels had their own pastors in the 90s. Whatever their shortcomings, as far as academic qualifications were concerned, they were more of experience, enthusiasm in the "cause", strong convictions and a marked sense of vocation. They had, moreover, an extraordinary knowledge of the Bible, from which they could quote freely, giving book, chapter and verse from scores of well-known texts, referring to them, as for example, "John 3 -16", assuming that's their heroes were as well acquainted with the Scriptures as they were. In religious views. The two pastors were inclined to be intolerant, even with one another, and especially so with the Anglicans. That their followers were mostly of humble origin in no way disturbed, for they considered that the Calvinists at the Green and the Independents of the Street were the elite of Mendlesham's spiritual realm, having far better sense of salvation than the church folk who put away their religion on Sunday night, along with their Sunday clothes.

Chapel sermons in the 90s were lengthy, seldom less than three quarters of an hour. Slowly, but persistently, the pastors laboured on, from point-to-point, till they reached the peroration, the grand climax. The older members relished these long addresses, hanging on to every word, often making audible ejaculations, such as "Amen", "Glory, Glory, Hallelujah ", "Praise the Lord", etc. Younger folk found it hard to sit through the long address, coming, as it did, soon after the long prayer. Even the Sunday school superintendent who wielded a long cane, sales to stop shuffling feet, constantly opening and shutting of hymn books and, of course, gazing at the clock. To all hints the pastors remained in different, for on no account could be peroration be foregone. At last, the climax was reached, usually heralded by such a remark as, "and just a few more words the friends". There, with arms upraised and eyes uplifted, and in tones halfway between speech and song, they seemed for a brief spell to belong to another world. Denunciation and admonishment were followed by exhortation and expectation. Thus, at last, with a solemn "Amen, amen", at last, the Bible was closed.

No picture of the religious life in Mendelssohn, 60 years ago, would be complete without mention of two Missioners, Mr J. H P Cutting and Brother John Harris of the Evangelical Society. Although vastly different in appearance, and type of service, they had much in common, viz the awakening of spiritual life in the remote villages of mid-Suffolk.

Mr James Cutting, travelling in a horse-drawn caravan, complete with tents, harmonium etc devoted the summer months to religious work amongst children and young people. Old East Anglia magazine readers will remember his visits to mid-Suffolk villages and the Felixstowe beach during the season.

Tall, good-looking, a prepossessing manner, with a pleasant tenor voice, he was always a welcome visitor in Mendlesham and district, despite the fact his religious views were somewhat stern. A game of rounders, however, with the youngsters more than compensated for his severity. Many a mid-Suffolk youth of those days owed there awakening in spiritual matters to Mr James Cutting of the Children's Special Service Mission, otherwise farmer and miller of Abbotts Hall, Pettaugh. Brother John Harris, ex-farm labourer and Missioner, was a man not easily forgotten. Almost every summer he pitched his "gospel tent" in Mr Thomas Lingwood lawn at Brockford. There, on Sunday afternoons, crowds of country folk gathered to hear him, many sitting amidst the trees and flowers, round about the tent. Brother John was by no means orthodox. I can still visualise him, on hot afternoons, removing his jacket and peeling up his sleeves, as a preliminary to the address, in which he declared war in the Devil and all his works. Then, with beads of perspiration rolling down his face, he appealed to all to join "the noble army of Christ" and join him in "fighting the good fight" with all their might. Yes! Brother John was beloved by all, especially the farm workers when leaving the village, seated high in a farm wagon, drawn by Suffolk Punches, people living by the wayside came to their garden gates to bid him adieu and God-speed.

New to our Village

We met on a dog walk – and what a lovely noisy welcome Mollie and Noche gave me! Miniature Schnauzers who brought their owners, **Julie and Hayden**, to Mendlesham from Sussex. Do they regret it? No! Walks every day in a lovely friendly village with wonderful countryside footpaths, what more could they want? And when their owners go out for the day, they even have a Dog Sitter, found amongst the adverts in the Parish Newsletter.

Julie and Hayden married in 2008 and created a blended family of 3 sons and 2 daughters. Suffolk was not new to them as Julie's grandparents came from Suffolk and her daughter is getting married this August to a man from Mendlesham Green. What a sensible girl!

What was their first impressions of moving to Mendlesham? Without a doubt, getting to know their neighbours and noticing that, even in lockdown, when meeting someone in the street, always getting a smile and a warm greeting something not always apparent in busy and bustling towns. They also appreciated just how, when visiting in the past, vibrant our villages are; full of volunteers from litter pickers to putting on events such as the street fair, coffee mornings and other clubs and organisations.

Julie and Hayden are no strangers to participating and contributing to a local community. Hayden, a Mechanical Engineer working for Glaxo Smith and Kline after a short stint in the army, has run 38 Marathons! Julie has been a 'Bobby on the Beat' for Surrey & Sussex Police force and then worked as a Community Centre Manager. Her proudest achievement was setting up a local support group for women subject to domestic violence https://www.womensaid.org.uk/information-support/. Now with a bit more time to spare, Julie would welcome the opportunity set up a Craft and Jewellery making group and Hayden to join a cycling group – so watch this space!



My name is Adrian Last and have lived in Mendlesham since 1994. I am a keen clay pigeon shooter and have previously won European and World titles shooting as one of the British Team. I am a parapleagic and have lived 30 years of my life in a wheelchair after a Moto Cross accident in 1990.

In May I took part in the English Open English Sporting Clay Pigeon shooting competition, shooting along side 200 other able bodied shooters in C class, I shot 90 ex 120 on the first day of the competition in wet and windy conditions and my score was still high at the end of the fifth day, I was 3 clay's clear of second place. For my effort I was awarded a gold medal a large silver challenge trophy and a glass keep sake trophy too. As well as this I also won the Disabled sitting category and a second gold medal and a challenge trophy too.

All be it Richard Faulds won on 112 ex 120, he was the double Trap winner in the 2000 Sydney Olympics.

This is the first time I have ever won a Major competition like it, as my other European and World titles were shooting against other disabled competitors.





² He sets the time for birth and the time for death, the time for planting and the time for pulling up, ³ the time for killing and the time for healing, the time for tearing down and the time for building. ⁴ He sets the time for sorrow and the time for joy, the time for mourning and the time for dancing, ⁵ the time for making love and the time for not making love, the time for kissing and the time for not kissing.

⁶ He sets the time for finding and the time for losing, the time for saving and the time for throwing away, ⁷ the time for tearing and the time for mending, the time for silence and the time for talk. ⁸ He sets the time for love and the time for hate, the time for war and the time for peace.

The above passage is one of my favourites, and reminds us even though at times it may not feel like, that there is a rhythm and pattern to our lives, also that things do happen in God's time, and not ours. Even though we want things to occur in our time we must learn to be patient.

Over the last 17 or so months, our patterns and rhythms of life have certainly changed, and at times we have not known where things are heading, but now as we start coming out of this uncertain time, but learning to live with the Covid virus we still need to take time, and space and place it all in the hands of God, because it will still be a time of uncertainty, worry and even fear for some, we must give others the space to regain their patterns and rhythms of life.

Our passage reminds us that along with the bad does come the good, but sometimes we need patience to wait for the good to happen again, and we will come through this stronger and better people with the help of God.

Father Philip writes...

Our beer label for this year's Summer Festival Weekend (13th – 15th August) is copied from the gate in the Lady Chapel


given in memory of John Herron. AMR under a crown. **A**ve **M**aria **R**egina – the Latin for 'Hail Mary, Queen'. St John, in the Book of Revelation, writes:

"A great sign appeared in Heaven – a woman clothed with the sun and the moon under her feet – and on her head a crown of 12 stars." Revelation 12 v 1

These words apply to the Church and to Mary, who is a sign of the Church. We must not think of her in isolation but close to Jesus. It is generally believed that Mary died but that like Elijah in the Old Testament, she shared bodily in Christ's Resurrectioin by being



assumed into Heaven after death. Her body is no longer mortal, subject to the limits of space and time. It is glorified and immortal – a sign of what lies in store



for all who are saved by the grace of Jesus Christ. The Assumption may be compared with the resurrection of the body which St Paul describes in 1 Thessalonians 4 v 7, speaking of those who will be alive at the end of time. They will, he says, "be caught up in the clouds together... to meet in the air, and... will be with the Lord forever." Of course this language is symbolic, as any language must be in dealing with such a mystery, but it expresses reality. Mary has experienced fully what we will all experience at the end of time.

Mary is Queen of Heaven. This means Our Lady is greater in dignity than all he angels and saints. The story begaun at Nazareth had for her reached its climax. To many it had ended with the Cross, but for her it is an ending in glory.

Thoughts on 2 Corinthians 8 v 1-9 & 2 Corinthians 9 v 6-11

Owing to Covid-19 we have had no fundraising events for nearly 2 years and St Mary's Mendlesham is always in need of money. We were the only parish in the old Stowmarket Deanery which did not manage to pay our share of the diocesan quota and we have not been able to start to raise funds to replace the lead on the Nave roof which is leaking.

In the Bible passages cited above St Paul is asking for money as he takes up a collection for the nearly bankrupt Jerusalem Church. He points to the example of the Macedonian Chrisitans who showed phenomenal generosity despite their own financial problems. "God loves a cheerful giver." Our giving acknowledges that our wealth is a gift and not something to be hoarded for our own benefit. It symbolises the work we do and enables us to share in the mission of our church. Above all it demonstrates our faith in God's continuing generosity to us. Our festival will be our first opportunity for months to contribute to the work of St Mary's. Everything we own today wil some day belong to someone else, but our relationship with the Lord which we have shaped over a lifetime remains with us through life, death and into eternity.

Bishop Mike Harrison, Bishop of Dunwich, in a sermon here on Giving told this story which sadly reflects many people's attitude to giving. He said it was so easy to leave responsibility to someone else:

"A man and woman had marital difficulties. They came to see the local Vicar. After a while it became apparent to the Vicar that the man's wife needed chrishing and affirming, so he came round from his desk and without saying anything hugged the wife. He then resumed his seat and turning to the husband said, "Now that's what your wife needs at least 3 times a



week." ... The man paused for a thought and said, "All right, Vicar; I'll bring her here Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays!"

We can easily be blind to our own responsibilities. There is sometimes an assumption that things will carry on as they are, whether we give or not, and this is not the case. Please give generously.
