While chatting we realised that many years ago we had been walking together with a group of mutual friends. It was good to catch up.

"We wanted to live in a village that was pretty, friendly, had a Health Centre, a Pub and a sense of community, and Mendlesham ticked all the boxes" Linda replied without any hesitation.

They moved into a brand new bungalow in 2018 and have no regrets. Born in Ely but living most of her life in Suffolk with a little dalliance to Essex, she wanted to return to the area and Chris, her 'Essex Man' was happy to take on a new county. As for many people whose husbands or wives fall terminally ill, caring for them and living your own life can be tough but as Linda says "Life is what it is and I have been fortunate to find myself and can hold on to many fond memories".

Linda used to work in Child Care and in later years ran a pub. She has two daughters and 3 grandchildren with relatives in the USA, as her father was an American. Chris worked in London and has three children and six grandchildren. All the grandchildren were page boys and bridesmaids at their wedding and took seats on the top table.

"Coming to the village has opened up opportunities for new friendships and interests" she said. Having joined the Art Group (run by Irene Hart <u>https://www.irenehart.co.uk</u>) when Covid restrictions 'stopped play', she became part of the WhatsApp art group, consolidating those new friendships. As the restrictions lifted, meeting up for coffee on patios and back gardens was an added bonus. Even more so when her washing machine broke down and the parts took 4 weeks to arrive, she found that touting her washing around to friends increased her schedule of coffee mornings and chats!

Church Goers and Chapel Goers (Mendlesham) by Walter Tye (1950s) Continued from page 13 in the June newsletter

Thus, from morning to night, they moved in an atmosphere of restriction, the meals being the only break. Then, when the long winter evenings came, and church attendance was impossible, the family gathered round the fire singing hymns. This, being informal, was the most enjoyable part of the day. As a special treat, we were often allowed to choose our favourite hymns. It was a relief on Monday to don the weekday clothes.

I well remember one Sunday afternoon when my older brothers, for a change, played "hare and hounds" over a hedge, ditch and row. This, of course, met with strong disapproval from our parents. When returning home, looking dirty and dishevelled, we were met by a visiting aunt who, with arms raised, upbraided them for breaking the sabbath. finally calling out, "You ought to be ashamed of yourselves, you wicked boys, you'll all comes to the gallows". I'm glad to say that Aunt Sally's prognostications did not come true. In fact, one of those "wicked boys" later, entered Holy Orders.

Every sabbath morning families could be seen making their way to church or chapel, mostly by road, others by devious foot parts and green lanes. Some carried little bags of food to stay the day. Elderly farmers, with their families, drove down in pony traps. Younger folks walked, saying that even horses needed a rest one day in seven. Should a penny farthing cycle, pedestrians soon called out, you ought to be ashamed of yourself, kicking up so much dust on the Sunday. Right when he wants of Sainsbury to do it now. Yeah, sooner or To avoid being soiled by passing traffic, older folks, proud of their Sunday clothes, often clambered into the hedgerows.

The most spectacular figure seen in this weekly procession was a smallholder from "The Green", old Charlie Buckle always turned up on his donkey. With his long black coat, tall silk hat, flowing scarf and beard, he much resembled an Eastern patriarch. Unfortunately, Ned had a habit of shying at passers-by. Charles was most upset when Ned broke the ranks of the vicarage ladies, mother and six tall daughters. The more he tried to avoid them, the more that stubborn old ass pushed his hindquarters amongst them, much to the amusement of onlookers. Ned obviously had no sense of class distinction and preferential treatment.

For some minutes before St Mary's services began the village folk gathered round the church gates, talking over the latest news, and incidentally casting an eye on the elite as they passed by. Not until the vicarage, doctors and farmers' families had taken their seats did the lower orders ever think of entering the church. And not until the bell ceased tolling and strains of the organ came over the air, with that critical little crowd remove their hats and move slowly, but reverently, toward the northern porch, eventually taking their customary seats at the back of the church.

THE REFILL REVOLUTION

As a nation we are getting better at recycling and are becoming more aware of plastic waste and the effects it has on our planet but there is still a long way to go and single use plastics is something we can all reduce in our daily lives without too much effort.

Choose Refills are a new Stowmarket based mobile eco refill shop offering a range of eco friendly and vegan cleaning liquids and hair and body products. We also have our own range of natural self care products such as soap bars, hand lotions and more liquid refills that are locally made in Stowmarket, helping to support local producers too.

Refilling your empty bottles is becoming more popular but refill stations tend to be in the larger towns. We wanted to make it easier for everyone to refill so our mobile shop is making regular stops in smaller villages throughout Mid Suffolk, bringing the refill revolution to rural areas. Working with local communities we have regular refill shop locations giving customers the opportunity to bring their bottles along to be refilled from our bulk containers. Once these are empty we send them back to our suppliers to be cleaned, refilled and reused, ensuring the closed loop system of recycling.

So, after much planning and Covid delays, *Choose Refills* first rural pop up

shop was held on Saturday 1st May at The Punchbowl Community Inn, Battisford which was very successful and in the space of two hours, we refilled over 45L of liquids, saving at least 60 single use plastic bottles. We

are constantly striving to make our service available to all so have introduced free local delivery and doorstep refills as well as a click and collect service from our pop up shops.

Together we really can make a difference!

Father Philip writes...

This month I am continuing last month's theme about God's forgiveness, with thoughts based on the parable of the

Prodigal Son in St Luke's Gospel, Ch 15 v 11-31, which we studied during Lent.



Some religious leaders were grumbling about Jesus, saying, "This man welcomes outcasts and even eats with them." So Jesus told them a parable:

"There was once a man who had two sons. The younger one demanded his inheritance, left home, spent all and returned broke. He was still a long way

from home when his father saw him, ran to meet him and kissed him. His father told his servants, "Put a ring n his finger and shoes on his feet.... And let us celebrate with a feast."

Kissing his son shows that the father welcomed him back totally. Putting shoes on his feet shows him that he had forgiven him totally. Shoes were a sign of a free person; bare feet the sign of a slave. Putting a ring on his son's finger shows that he restored him to full family status



The second half of Jesus' parable concerns the older son. He was angry that his father was celebrating his brother's return, even though his father begs him to do the same. Jesus ended his parable withot saying what the older son eventually did. That older son stands for the religious leaders who resented



the fact that Jesus had chosen to celebrate with those who were 'lost' but had now been 'found'. Jesus constructed his parable in such a way that each religious leader must write his own ending to it. Each must decide whether or not to 'go inside and join the festivities' or 'stay outside and sulk'.

Jesus came for those who humbly recognise the need to change their lives. The Prodigal Son was determined to make a miserable 3-part speech as soon as he got home. He would not let his father love him or forgive him. Furthermore he decided unilaterally what his punishment should be.

The miserable speech ran like this:

- 1. "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you."
- 2. "I am convinced I am not worthy to be considered your son."
- 3. "I am determined that you should never accept me, but you should treat me as your slave.



God's forgiveness does not belittle sin as though it were a matter of small importance. How can it do so when it cost God-made-Man such intense suffering and his execution on the Cross? It is not God's will that we should leave our Father's home and become a prodigal. It is not God's will that we love him in a selfish way and become

narrow and hard towards 'prodigal sons', keeping them in a far country.

If the younger son on returning home had met his older brother before he met his father, it's highly likely he would never have reached home again at all. The older brother was cold. He spoke of his brother as "**your son**". He seemed to be one of those self-righteous types who would cheerfully kick someone down even



further into the gutter by saying, *"He made his bed; let him lie on it!"* He had a mind that jumped to conclusions. There is no mention of prostitutes until he brought up the subject. One gets the feeling that he accused his brother of things he would have liked to commit himself.

This parable reminds us that we can be brought to life again and found when we have lost our way. As the hymnwriter Fr Faber wrote:



For the love of God is broader Than the measures of man's mind; And the heart of the Eternal Is most wonderfully kind.

But we make his love too narrow By false limits of our own; And we magnify his strictness With a zeal he will not own.

I hope St Mary's is a church where all of us find a warm welcome to our Father's house
