#### Mendlesham and Wickham Skeith Community First Responders (CFR)

It is with deep regret that the Mendlesham and Wickham Skeith Community First Responder (CFR) Group will no longer be active within the community. I have taken the decision to cease responding and close down the CFR group due to lack of local volunteers willing to become First Responders. The equipment will be returned to the East of England Ambulance Service Trust for redistribution to other groups who have many more volunteers. The volunteer group was set up in its present form around 2009 from an existing local CFR group. At that time there were between 8 and 10 volunteers supporting the community, covering hundreds of 999 calls.

For the last 5-6 years I have remained the only member of that group (a sole responder) actively involved in responding and delivering training to other local CFR groups. Despite many attempts at recruiting support from the local community it has proved impossible to increase the groups numbers. There have been many who have shown interest, and to them I would like to thank them for that interest, however, for many reasons, some personal and some logistical no-one has completed the training and commenced responding.

I would also like to thank the Mendlesham Community and Parish Councils for their support in funding equipment and running costs over the years, it was appreciated.

**Community Centre:** Further to the decision agreed in principle to sell the Community Centre to provide a SEND unit and room for the school to grow, it is really exciting to see the work currently being undertaken to the old Small Hall. There is still much legal work to be agreed so that the SEND can open and we then progress towards a sale. The new building community project has commenced with a working party currently reviewing potential Architect and Project Manager candidates and funding proposals to pay for these initial stages. Shortly, we will have proposals as agenda items to appoint candidates and we will then start public consultation on what, where, etc?

This is our first priority and is/will take up the majority of resources we have, but it is certainly exciting and will provide us with community facilities fit for purpose and our growing community needs for many years to come.

#### Mendlesham Community Council <u>Update</u>

The Trustees of the MCC are delighted to let you know that the **Open Extraordinary Meeting and AGM** held in September was a success!

89 people completed the Questionnaire giving their views on how the MCC should proceed. 47 people attended the meetings and a new way of operating to capitalise on the success of the past years was agreed; the future is now secure.

We have received nominations for a new management team and will be looking at revising the Constitution, clarifying Membership and reviewing how funds will continue to be raised to support the community. *Contact details were not available at the time of going to print but will be released as soon as possible, so WATCH THIS SPACE!* 

The 50:50 Shop, Newsletter and Tote will continue to operate and not only will some of the previous events be reinstated but new ones are on the horizon.

Thank you to everyone who made a contribution through completing the questionnaire and attending the meeting. We hope that you feel that your voice has been heard and the changes afoot will meet the needs of a modern and diverse community.

Please continue to give you support and views – we need to ensure that everyone is included. If you would like to know more, want to volunteer or are interested in becoming a Trustee, let us know.

#### Summary of Accounts year ending 31 July 2021:

The financial year started with £11,429.34 and closed with a balance of £12,616.23. All overhead costs were settled including Public Liability Insurance, Utility Bills towards the 50:50 shop and £1,212 funds were distributed. The main source of income this year was via the 50:50 Shop and Tote. Our thanks go to the volunteers who kept things going as and when they could during this difficult year ..... and to all the people who visited the shop and bought tote tickets.

During the past 40 years it is estimated that £400,000 has been raised and given back to the community to support individuals and organisations.

The AGM ended with a presentation of gifts of appreciation to the outgoing officers and our heartfelt thanks go to Carolyn Triscott, Nancy Bagnall and Meg Clarke for all their support and hard work during the past years.



#### Remember, remember the fifth of November The gunpowder treason and plot. I see no reason why gunpowder treason Should ever be forgot.

The opening of this poem is one that we all remember from childhood, and it could be said that the first 2 words sum up the month of November,

(Remember, remember). In the Christian calendar, it starts on the 1<sup>st</sup> of November (mainly for Roman Catholics, Lutherans, and Anglicans) All Saints Day is a universal Christian Feast that honours and remembers all Christian

saints, known and unknown. On the 2<sup>nd</sup> of November it is All Souls Day, the commemoration of all the <u>faithful</u> departed, (again mainly for Roman Catholics, Lutherans, and Anglicans).

Then, of course, there is bonfire night on the 5<sup>th</sup> of November, not a Christian festival but came about by the struggle between Catholics and Protestants. In 1605, Guy Fawkes and a group of conspirators attempted to blow up the Houses of Parliament. After Queen Elizabeth I died in 1603, English Catholics who had been persecuted under her rule had hoped that her successor, James I, would be more tolerant of their religion. James I had, after all, had a Catholic mother. Unfortunately, James did not turn out to be more tolerant than Elizabeth, and a number of young men, 13 to be exact, decided that violent action was the answer.

To carry out their plan, <u>the conspirators</u> got hold of 36 barrels of gunpowder - and stored them in a cellar, just under the House of Lords. But as the group worked on the plot, it became clear that innocent people would be hurt or killed in the attack, including some people who even fought for more rights for Catholics. Some of the plotters started having second thoughts.

One of the group members even sent an anonymous letter warning his friend, Lord Monteagle, to stay away from the Parliament on November 5th. The warning letter reached the King, and the King's forces made plans to stop the conspirators. <u>Guy</u> <u>Fawkes</u>, who was in the cellar of parliament with the gunpowder when the authorities stormed it in the early hours of November 5th, was caught, tortured and executed. On the very night that the Gunpowder Plot was foiled, on November 5th, 1605, bonfires were set alight to celebrate the safety of the King. Since then, November 5th has become known as <u>Bonfire Night</u>. The event is commemorated every year with fireworks and burning effigies of Guy Fawkes on a bonfire.

Then we have Remembrance Day and Remembrance Sunday when we as a nation remember the Guns falling silent on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month at 11 minutes past the 11<sup>th</sup> hour to mark the end of the First World War, and all the wars after that right up to the present day. Whatever we think of wars, sometimes it seems to be necessary to keep our freedoms. Whilst we are remembering all this we also remember (as we do every Sunday and every day) the price Christ paid for us on the cross. Keep remembering in the peace of God.



#### **Fr Philip Writes**

In November the Church concentrates on remembering the dead, beginning with All Souls' Day (2<sup>nd</sup> Nov) the Service of Light (6<sup>th</sup>

Nov) the blessing of candles for departed loved ones (7<sup>th</sup> Nov) and Remembrance Sunday (14<sup>th</sup> Nov). There are also several Requiems: for relatives and friends, those who have been forgotten and those who have committed suicide. We know very little about life after death, but when we turn to the Bible it Is crystal clear that God is all loving, caring and patient and longs to give us life to the full.

Christians believe that life continues beyond death. Fr Bede Jarrett, an



eminent Dominican historian and author, describes death as flows: "Death is only a horizon and a horizon is nothing but the limit of our sight."

The empty tomb on Easter Day explained it all. Life is changed, not

ended, and birth and death have much in common. The child in its mother's womb has a cosy existence and all its needs are provided for, but there is more to life than food, warmth and security. If the child is to grow to its full potential, it must leave its mother's womb and quit one world for another and 'die' to be born. Birth, like death, is seldom easy.


By his Father's House, Jesus meant heaven Most people enter the world crying and few leave it without regret. This world is like a womb and Jesus said we had to be born again to enter the Kingdom of Heaven. God is a loving Father with a

capacity of love and forgiveness which is beyond the ability of us mere

mortals to appreciate. Fr Bede Jarrett also said, "When I die, I would prefer to be judged by God than my own mother."

This month is also associated with cleansing from sin. The Church uses

powerful symbols of Holy Water (also a symbol of growth) and Incense - a symbol of prayer. We pray for all the dead in Christ and all the dead whose faith is known to God alone. Death is. indeed, "putting out the lamp because Dawn has arrived."
