Mendlesham Parish Party 2023 SAVE THE DATE

The Mendlesham Parish Party Committee held their Annual General Meeting on Thursday 15th September 2022 and it ended up being a very positive, albeit a lengthy meeting. There were several key topics that we needed to discuss (hence the long article!!) For those of you that are new to the village or may have come of age, the Parish Party is held for members of the parish that are 66 years old or above or registered disabled. It doesn't matter how long you have lived in the village but you do need to live permanently within Mendlesham.

The first important discussion was around the Covid situation and we felt it would be up to the individual if they wish to attend. We have decided to move the Parish Party to **Saturday 22nd April 2023**. The thoughts behind this are that seasonal colds and flu would have past and the weather would be warmer for people coming out in the evening. If we need to keep doors and window vents open for better circulation, it will be less of a problem.

The second important discussion was around the Community Centre Hall. In the past, we have always used all the building's facilities. Now the small hall is no longer available, we will have to adapt how we organise the party. For us, the most important part is keeping this wonderful tradition in our village going, even if it means a few tweaks here or there. We are going to have to slightly reduce the numbers of guests we can seat due to needing an area at the back of the hall to organise things, so we will be doing a first come first served booking system. We will no longer be visiting every guest with an invitation so if you wish to attend, you will need to contact the committee to book your seat. We will provide a telephone number and email address in January NEWSLETTER and we will not be taking bookings before this date to keep it fair for everyone.

The third important discussion was around the structure of the party. We want the party to be a success and so the menu for the next Parish Party will be a Ploughman's Style meal with dessert, tea and coffee and drinks. There will be entertainment and hopefully and good time will be had by all.

We will also be holding a Coffee Morning on **Saturday 14th January 2023** and it would be lovely to see you all there.

citizens advice Mid Suffolk

Last year I fell for a scam when I was doing my Christmas shopping. The scam was clever. I thought I was getting a good deal but didn't realise I was being scammed until it was too late. How can I avoid the same thing happening again this year?

Scammers' tactics become more sophisticated every year, making scams tricky to recognise, but there are things you can look out for.

If it seems too good to be true, it probably is. For example, tickets to an event that are much cheaper than they're being sold elsewhere, or a holiday that's a lot less than you'd expect to pay.

Be wary of people contacting you out of the blue on social media sites or via text and email offering an item for sale or deal on something.

Do your research. If you're buying from a website you haven't used before, spend a few minutes researching it. A good place to start is finding a website's terms and conditions. You should also look up the company's address, this can normally be found in the website's 'contact us' section and should have a street name, not just a PO box. If it's a registered UK company you can check its details on the Companies House website at gov.uk/get-information-about-a-company

Check to see what people have said about the company. It's worth looking at different review websites to see other people's feedback – don't rely on reviews the company has put on its own website.

Scammers will often ask you to pay in an unusual way, or very quickly. For example, you're asked to send money through a transfer service like MoneyGram or Western Union or pay via vouchers.

Remember never give away your personal information like a password or PIN and never click on or download anything you don't trust.

If you've transferred money, speak to your bank and the police. You should also contact the police if the scammer is in your area or you feel unsafe.

Don't feel embarrassed about reporting a scam – scammers are clever and it can happen to anyone.

Reporting a scam helps track down and stop scammers, helping to prevent it from happening to others too.

<u>Suggestion for the shoeboxes</u> Thermal gloves, socks, hats, scarf, rollon deodorant (no aerosols) toothbrush & paste, soft sweets, chocolate, plasters, wet wipes, windup torch, aluminium thermal blanket, dried coffee/soup sachets, notepad, pens, envelopes, stamps and a really nice touch would be to include a Christmas Card.

Doggy box Dried dog food, treats, chews, toys, collar, lead, bowl, dog coat, fleece blanket.

All the above are just suggestions please feel free to add anything you think would be useful.

All the shoeboxes stay local. They are taken to the night shelter in Ipswich and also to the soup kitchens and hostels. Any extra go to Bury and Norwich.

If you cannot do a shoebox but would still like to help with a donation, any of the items listed would be very much appreciated. I made an extra 15 boxes from donations last year which really boosted the total.

Boxes or items can be dropped off at my house any time from now **until Saturday 10h December**.

White heather is supposed to be lucky and sea poppies are very pretty but I doubt we will be finding them in Mendlesham.

It was an interesting talk and lovely slides.

Greetings from the Foresters Friendly Society local branch 'Brave Old Oak'

The name Foresters originated from its first members who recognised their shared duty to assist their fellow men and women who needed help 'as they walked through the forest of life'. The Victorian Era in Britain saw the rise of the Friendly Society as members acknowledged that by paying small amounts into a common fund, they would be able to offer sick pay and funeral grants. The Suffolk area was home to many branches, including 'Brave Old Oak', based in Mendlesham. Each branch met at local halls, pubs or branch owned buildings, such as the former 'Foresters Hall', which still stands on Debenham High Street.

You may remember some of the historical branches which were based in the Suffolk area, from 'Star of Suffolk' and 'Friend in Need' to the 'Duke of Edinburgh' branch of Bacton and Stowmarket's women's only branch 'Gertrude Marriot'. Branch 4195 'Royal Oak' met at the Boar Inn, High Street, whilst branch 'Prince of Wales' met at the King's Head in Stowmarket. Over sixty active branches were listed in the 1904 Society Directory, an example of the Foresters history that resides in the Suffolk area. Providing financial and social support to its members has been the main purpose of Foresters Friendly Society and has remained their ethos to this very day.

Over the years, members have participated in Foresters processions on Front Street, Mendlesham, where 'Brave Old Oak' still meet today.



Beatrix Wrinch, branch Secretary said "Years have gone by, but the need for mutuality and support has remained the same. Foresters Friendly Society has a wealth of history in the local area for supporting members and our active branch, situated in Mendlesham, has lots to offer. From regular social events, such as band concerts, quizzes and meals out providing a sense of friendship and community, to supporting charities every year. 





I think it is true to say that we all like to sing carols at Christmas, the telling of the Christmas story through carols. The traditional carol service still seems to be one service that is still well attended, with congregations expecting to sing their favourite carol. But did you know that the tradition of singing carols did not start in Churches?

We need to go back to Anglo-Saxon times, when we find a tradition of 'wassailing' the word 'wassail' probably comes from the Old Norse 'ves heill' meaning 'be well and in good health' and was a toast. It was accompanied with a bowl of beer or cider which could be hot and spiced known as 'wassail'. The singers would go round pubs, village greens and households to give a blessing for the season. In some places villages would gather on the Twelfth Night in orchards and select a King and Queen in an elaborate ceremony who would then walk around the trees with bread soaked in cider and place this at the trees, as the other villagers would bang pots and pans to wake the trees up from there winter sleep.

You may remember the carol' Here we come a-wassailing' which speaks of this practice:

Here we come a-wassailing Among the leaves so green, Here we come a-wand'ring So fair to be seen. Love and joy come to you, And to you your wassail, too, And God bless you, and send you A Happy New Year, And God send you a Happy New Year.

One of our earliest carols is O come all ye faithful, attributed to St Bonaventure who lived in the thirteenth century and being set to music in 1700's but it is not until Victorian times that the singing of carols takes off, when a lot of the carols we still sing today were written.

I hope you will attend a carol service this year to keep this tradition going but however you keep you Christmas, have a Blessed one.

room. This is what happened to Christ during all of his life, for people so often rejected Him. They could find no room in their lives for Him because they were full of themselves or did not want him. Jesus St Luke tells us that when Mary and Joseph applied for hospitality it was refused because there was no



said He had no place to live in and nowhere to lay his head. In the end His own people had no room for Him and crucified Him.

Today many people refuse to accept Christ because they are so full of their own activities that there is no room in their lives for Him. Christ knocks at the door of their hearts. He wants to share a meal with them but they keep the door closed against Him. Fortunately there are those who do invite Him in and He



promised that if they did welcome Him He would come and live with them. St Paul could say, "I no longer live, but Christ Jesus lives within me." As we enter in imagination the stable at Bethlehem, let us remember that Christ is there so we can be born

again and live a new life and also say with St Paul: "For me to live is Christ."

Christmass has several different levels, some more superficial than the others. It is hard completely to escape 'Consumer Christmass' with the aggressive merchandise of



goods: e.g. "You need a new sofa to make a good Christmass," though that can prove so empty.




The next layer is more subtle – a 'Dickensian Christmass' – cards with snow, log fires, turkey and plum pudding etc. There is a lot to be said for what lies behind all of these because they stress goodwill and friendship, but without Jesus there is a hollow ring and they, too, become empty.

The deeper layer - what Christmass is really about – is a simple **CRIB**. Jesus is

in Eternity, yet came to earth as a baby to show us how very much God loves us. He wants to be born in our hearts and lives. Please make room for Him today. It was Mother Teresa who said,

"Welcome Jesus at Christmasstide — not in the cold manger of our heart but in a heart full of love and humanity, a heart warm with love for one another."
