New Parish Councillor required.

Further to the opportunity provided for the electorate to request an election to fill our Parish Councillor vacancy, we have now received confirmation from Mid Suffolk District Council that an election has not been requested which now means that the Parish Council can proceed and co opt a new Parish Councillor.

Co option means that it will be the Parish Council making the decision, rather than the residents of Mendlesham Parish voting at an election.

If you are interested in applying for this position you need to be eligible, including

- be at least 18 years old
- be a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of any member state of the European Union, and meet at least one of the following four qualifications:

a. You are, and will continue to be, registered as a local government elector for the parish/community in which you wish to stand from the day of your nomination onwards. **Or**

b. You have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish/community area during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election **Or**

c. Your main or only place of work during the 12 months prior to the day of your nomination and the day of election has been in the parish/community area. **Or**

d. You have lived in the parish/community area or within three miles of it during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election.

- Not be disqualified under section 80 of the Local Government Act 1972 or section 34 of the Localism Act 2011 (further details available on request, but includes bankruptcy and criminally convicted for a period of not less than three months without the option of a fine)
- Mendlesham Parish Council welcome and are committed to the inclusion and recognition of all regardless of race, culture, ability, ethnicity or gender identity and expression, sexual orientation, marital status, religious affiliation, and socioeconomic status.

The process for co option will be for written applications to be received by the Parish Clerk by **31st January 2022**. Applications need to include brief information about yourself, including name, address, work/ life history experiences and the skills that you think you would be able to bring to the Parish Council and why you wish to stand.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the Parish Clerk or any Parish Councillor.

All candidates will then be asked to attend the Parish Council meeting of 9th February, to meet the Councillors and ask or be asked any questions, before a decision is reached at that meeting.

Times Past.

Progress or Decline - that is the question? Stowmarket now joins Stowupland in one direction, Haughley in another and Combs in another. Elmswell and Wetherden practically link up; Bacton and Mendlesham, residentially, continue to expand, at a rate never before experienced; as does Needham Market. I can now think of only very few small villages that remain basically as they were in the days of my youth: Creeting St. Peter, Gipping, Braiseworth. Obviously the answer to my opening comment is one of individual opinion but it is interesting to go back 99 years to note how Mendlesham has changed since 1922!

"Mendlesham is a parish and village, with a station on the Mid Suffolk Light Railway; 3.5 miles S.E. of Finningham station on the Ipswich and Norwich section of the Great Eastern Railway. Leonard Stannard, porter in charge. The church of St. Mary is a handsome stone structure, in the Perpendicular style. Vicar: Rev. Edmund Richard Manwaring-White. This was one of 21 churches in Suffolk, Norfolk and Essex conferred by William Rufus, in the year 1095, upon Battle Abbey. The churchyard was enlarged by one acre in 1876 and the register dates from 1558. Here is a Congregational Chapel built in 1848 and there is a Baptist Chapel on the Green built in 1839.

The parish had a police station, Henry Turrrell being the constable in charge, with Mendlesham Fire Brigade being located nearby, where Allan Baker was the Superintendent and had a crew of 7 firemen. Carpenters and wheelwrights at Mendlesham Green were the Arbon family and Mrs. Charlotte Arbourne ran the Green's grocery shop. Hugh Brundish was the boot and shoe maker there, as was Henry Steggall and Arthur List was their counter-part at the Street. Frederick Reason and Mrs. Emma Martin were shopkeepers; Victor Pizzy, the butcher and Charles Lockwood a pork butcher. Should your horses need attention, Chas. & Stanley Nunn were on hand, with Albert Hart having the Forge at the Green. Ernest Holt was the local saddler. If not a horseman and your cycle needed repair, Stanley Turner was your man. Alfred S Rous was Mendlesham's jeweller!

Herbert Brundish had a windmill and A.E. Kent was the steam-miller at the Street. Herbert Abbott, likewise, at the Green - he was also a corn and flour merchant and local carrier; Charles Jolly was also a carrier - to Eye, Stowmarket and Ipswich. Sheppard Reason was the local baker. So much local enterprise but by far the biggest local business was run by A. & M. Cutting who are described as: general providers, grocers, provision dealers, ironmongers, hop and malt merchants, house furnishers, general and fancy drapers, general outfitters, newsagents, boot and shoe dealers and a sub-branch of Lloyds Bank, which was open daily from 10. until 3.30pm. They also had a shop at Stonham.

David Buckel was a beer retailer, as was J.B. Howard and the Oak Inn, King's Head and Green Man trading with full licences. Local chimney sweep was Wm. Huggins. The area of the parish is 3862 acres; the soil is mixed, the sub-soil clay. Chief crops are: barley, wheat, peas, roots and beans and the land is very fertile. The population in 1911 was 927. Parish clerk = A. Baker and Miss Kate Juby Asst. Overseer. Mesrrs. Beaumont and son are Lords of the Manor and the principal landowners: O.W.H. Holmes and Mrs. Robinson. The Public Elementary School was built in 1863 and since improved, it will hold 176 children - Arthur Mayfield, master.

2021 - we have the Church, a Chapel in the Foresters Hall, a shop, a pub, houses and agricultural land. Where are the rest? Progress or decline, it's your choice!

citizens advice Mid Suffolk

I've been living in my privately rented flat for years. I generally have a good relationship with my landlord but I just can't get them to carry out various repairs that have built up. How can I get them to act - and what exactly do they have to do?

This must be a very frustrating situation. The law states that your landlord must provide accommodation that is safe, healthy and free from things that could cause serious harm.

You don't say exactly what repairs are needed. If you have problems such as electrical wiring that you think might be faulty, or there's damp, or an infestation by pests, the landlord has a legal obligation to put things right.

Landlords are also responsible for the maintenance of the general structure, and fittings such as boilers and radiators; basins, baths and toilets; and the drains.

The first step is to contact your landlord again, in writing. Include photographs of the problems. Keep a record of all communications and evidence relating to the disrepair.

If that doesn't prompt any action, the advisers at Citizens Advice can help with next steps. These could include contacting your local council (who will have dedicated officers for dealing with disrepair in private rented properties) or asking for a visit by the environmental health team.

Tenants can take their landlords to court to force them to carry out repairs. However, it's worth getting some advice and thinking carefully before embarking on this route.

Simona Pounds will now be leading the group as of Tuesday 29th November.



Tiffin Recipe

There is a lot of flexibility in this recipe so experiment to discover the best combinations which suit you.

Ingredients

500g biscuits (e.g. Rich Tea, Digestive, Hobnobs)
50g margarine or butter
2 tablespoons cocoa powder or drinking chocolate or similar
2 tablespoons Golden Syrup (or maple syrup)
1 tablespoon sugar
500g chocolate
1 can condensed milk or carnation caramel

Optional additional extra

handful sultanas or raisins, nuts, marshmallows, small pieces of fudge or Turkish Delight, chocolate chips (maybe 200g in total)

Method

1. Crush biscuits and set aside in a mixing bowl (Crush to a variety of sizes so that you leave some chunks of biscuit as well as have crumbs. Don't leave the biscuit pieces too large, however, or the finished slab will tend to break up when cut. Different kinds of biscuit will also affect the taste so you may wish to experiment). Add here any dry optional extras you wish to add e.g. marshmallows, nuts, chocolate chips, fudge bits.

(It seems that different types of biscuit and different types of chocolate have differing properties and so you may have to experiment with quantities a bit. The aim is to get the consistency as stiff as possible (hardly able to stir it with a wooden spoon) but with enough chocolate to enable the tiffin to set)

2. Break 300 grams chocolate in pieces into a microwavable bowl and add margarine (or butter), golden syrup, sugar, cocoa powder and condensed milk/caramel. (You can also add some optional extras here e.g. sultanas). Give the mixture a good stir. Microwave on low heat until all is melted/dissolved. (Alternatively use 200 grams of chocolate and add 100 grams of chocolate chips/grated chocolate to the biscuit mix)

3. Add the mixture to the biscuits and stir well.

4. Press the mixture down well into a baking tray and leave to cool. (I find lining the tray with cling film or tin foil makes it easy to turn out the tiffin once it is set. I also put my tiffin in the fridge to cool)

5. Melt the remaining 200 grams of chocolate and pour over the cooled tiffin . Again leave to cool.

6. Once the chocolate has set, you can drizzle with extra chocolate if you wish e.g. melted white chocolate. Turn out and cut into squares.

(Obviously you do not have to use the same type of chocolate and again you might wish to experiment with mixtures of dark, milk and white.)

There is a story about a leader of a certain Native American Indian tribe, whose people had been encamped for generations at the base

of a large mountain. He was dying and summoned his 3 sons to say, "I am dying. Before I die I must choose one of you to succeed me as head of our tribe. I want you to climb our holy mountain and bring back something beautiful. The one whose gift is the most outstanding will be the one who will succeed me."



One son brought back a rare and beautiful flower. The second son returned with a valuable stone. However, the third came back empty handed. He said to his father, "I have brought nothing back to show you, Father. I stood on top of the holy mountain and I saw that the other side was a beautiful land filled with pastures and a lake. I was so overwhelmed that our tribe could go there for a better life that I could not bring anything back."

"You will be the tribe's new leader," said the old man. "You have brought back the most precious thing of all – the gift of a better vision for a better future."



This story sums up my hopes for 2022.

We begin the year by celebrating Epiphany (on 2nd January this year). We commemorate how Jesus appeared to the nations, represented by the Wise men, who came 'from the East' and were not Jewish. Traditionally one has been depicted as Asian, one African and one European. They

presented different gifts: gold, frankincense and myrrh. They each had different personalities and came from different countries with different cultures but arrived together to honour the King of all. We must learn that we, too should be like Jesus and be open to everyone without drawing lines between "them" and "us" or 'grading' people in importance by colour or race.



In the dark of their night they saw the star, the new hope for a better world. That star brought out something in them that made them travel all the way from where they were to Jesus. It was their hope that made their trip possible.

I pray that we may begin 2022 with a better vision for a better future and experience the love of God revealed in Jesus. Happy New Year, Everyone!

Charities we support at Christmasstide

St Martins more than a horn for the homeless

St Martin's Housing Trust, Norwich - More than a home for the homeless.

At just 14 Alison ran away from home in Lowestoft and ended up in a children's home in Liverpool. She

said, "They got in touch with my mum to say I was there and she said, 'Keep her!"" From then onwards Ali fended for herself. When she first made contact with St Martin's she staved at 'Somewhere Safe to Stay Hub', where she was given a bed for a few days. She then moved on to Bishopsbridge House where she helped transform the garden into a beautiful space. She has since moved into a shared house in the community with support from St Martin's. There is concern over 2022 because of the end of furlough, the removal of the Universal Credit uplift and removal of the eviction ban. Given that the life



expectancy of a man on the streets is only 47 and 43 for a woman, loss of life amongst people experiencing homelessness is common.

We are fortunate that Graham and Anita maintain a close link with St Martin's on our behalf. We shall continue to collect socks, gloves, hats etc. until Christmasstide ends on 9th January.



Christian Aid

Our Crib Appeal concludes on 9th January. Over the last decade the effects of the Climate Crisis have been growing more devastating for families in South Sudan, where more than 1,066,000 people

have been affected by severe floods. Not only are many families facing hunger but with fragile water sources contaminated, the risk of deadly waterborne illnesses increase. Christian Aid has been able to provide 32,000 with access to safe drinking water; 11,500 safe hygienic sanitation and 1,900 households with training in improved agricultural practices. Chrisitan Aid uses our donations for such projects and where they consider the need is greatest.
