#### **OBITUARY** JOAN HILL

Joan was born on 18<sup>th</sup> May 1925 in Suffolk. She moved a number of times during her young life as her father was a Baptist minister. Joan trained as a nurse in London during World War 2 and nursed in London, Kent and Devon, where she met her first husband Frank. They spent many happy years together until he died. Joan married Arthur in 1970 and retired from nursing. They lived in happy retirement in Devon until Arthur died in 1993. In 2001 Joan moved back to Suffolk to be near her wider family. She quickly built a happy and active life with W.I., St Mary's church, Friends of St Mary's, Over 60's. Flower club and Jubilee Ladies' Choir. After the first Covid lockdown Joan had a hip replacement and although she recovered from this it left her much less mobile. Sadly this, combined with heart failure brought on a decline in her health and she died in April, just a few weeks short of her 97<sup>th</sup> birthday.

## **CONGRATULATIONS!**

To Krystal Vittles, who has been awarded the British Empire Medal for her services to public libraries. Krystal is head of service delivery for Suffolk Libraries and played a central role in establishing the mutual society which runs Suffolk Libraries, which is the first of its kind.

The awards citation says she has "been a trailblazer in exploring alternative delivery models and brokering partnership working, and leveraging her expertise in working with young people, to enhance and improve library services for the people of East Anglia."

It also says: "She spearheaded Suffolk Libraries' successful bid to become an Arts Council National Portfolio Organisation and co-designed a programme with young people and local artists to increase youth access and involvement with culture.

### <u>UK Power Networks (UKPN) – Priority Register for</u> <u>Vulnerable People.</u>

At the last visit of the Rural Coffee Caravan, we received info on power cuts and the help that UKPN can provide for older or vulnerable customers. This involved identifying people to UKPN, putting them in a priority category for various forms of help including the provision of a rechargeable torch. One torch was left with us and that was given away at a recent meeting of the Over 60's Club.

Several people have requested these and we have made enquiries with UKPN. Unfortunately, we are not able to pass on names as the company needs to verify need with people directly.

Therefore, anyone wishing to go onto the priority register is advised to ring UKPN on 105 and give their details.

#### James Bristow Baker - died 5th March 2022

Jim was the son of Stanley John Baker and Mary Ann Hill. He was born on the 23<sup>rd</sup> June 1925 at Vine Cottage, Mendlesham Green. He was the second youngest of 9 children. At the age of 5 he had to walk a mile and a half whatever the weather, to attend the school. During some play times the Mid Suffolk train used to stop at the Mendlesham station and passengers would often throw out half pennies and farthings onto the road. If lucky enough, after school he would take his gains and walk down Front Street to Arthur and Rosie List's sweet shop where he would buy sherbets and sticks of liquorice.

In 1931 at the age of 6, the family moved to Elm Farm, Wickham Skeith where he lived for 14 years. There was no electricity or running water so pond water was sieved through muslin to catch any unwanted bugs then this water was used for cooking and washing clothes. The nearest drinking water was over a mile away. He attended the school at Wickham Skeith until he left at the age of 14. He had little choice of work other than on the farm with his father who fattened cattle for Russell Fenning at White House Farm, Mendlesham. Then when Russell was short staffed he went and helped him with his free range poultry. He enjoyed the poultry work so he stayed with Russell and soon began to run the poultry on his own

In January 1945 he married Hazel Hales, a young girl from Cotton whom he met at a village dance. They lived at Elm Farm until 1946 when he started to create their home at Glenhaven where they raised their four children. The poultry business was thriving so in 1968 the company known as Fenning & Baker Poultry was formed and Jim became its Managing Director until he retired in 1993 at the age of 68 after 53 years at the farm. He had many loyal staff including John Lambert and Derek Webb.

Jim was very interested in the husbandry of livestock and served on many committees. He was involved with Thames Valley Eggs and became a director. In 1980 he was elected Vice Chairman and finally in 1989 he became its chairman, retiring in 1998 at the age of 73. At one point he was on 11 committees and served as chairman for 10 of them. He was a much respected man within the Poultry world and even travelled to Moscow, New York, Rome and Romania to attend Poultry Conferences in the 60s.

He was interested in village life and was a member of the Mendlesham Bowls club and became its Captain for 18 years. He served as a Parish Counsellor for 19 years. He was a committee member and chairman of the old village hall. He became a trustee of the Church & Town Estate in 1964 and was still there over 55 years later. In 1972, he became a Trustee of the Education Foundation Trust and served for 47 years and was its Chairman for 27 years. He was Chairman of The Pensioners Parish Party for twenty years until he eventually became of age to sit down at the party. In recent years he was a committee member of the Friends of St Mary's helping to raise money for the maintenance of the church. He also liked to travel and with his wife Hazel had many holidays and business trips around the world.

### CONNECTING COMMUNITIES MID SUFFOLK

A new travel service is now available for residents of local villages including Mendlesham and the Green. It is set up for people wanting to go to hospital appointments, the station, meetings, leisure events, shopping, social gatherings etc. and who have no means of getting there.

The mini bus holds 4 people in seats plus a wheelchair. The bus needs to be booked in advance and the fare is paid by card to the driver.

The hours are operational from early morning to early evening and on board there is information about other services. Connecting Communities is a charity and the driver is trained with Covid guidelines in place about keeping the bus clean in between journeys.

The current price list is: 1 to 4 miles £2.50 5 to 7 miles £4.00 8 to 10 miles £5.50 11 to 13 miles £7.00 14 to 16 miles £8.50 17 to 20 miles £10.00



Child fares remain at £1 per journey (under 16 years). Registered Carers remain free when supporting a passenger.

It is a personal, convenient travel service and is slightly more than a traditional bus fare and half the price of a taxi. A free bus pass cannot be used on this mini bus service.

It may be be helpful for people without transport of their own and who cannot get out of the village easily to attend appointments.

#### News from "The 50/50 Shop" - Mendlesham's best kept secret?

Within the village, tucked away on the playing fields, we have a hidden gem - the 50/50 Shop. Entirely staffed by volunteers, it has been running for over 30 years and over recent months we have been delighted to see many new faces visit.

If you haven't been before you'll find a treasure trove behind the wooden door! Open every Tuesday and Friday from 2pm - 4pm, with the occasional Saturday opening, head to the toddler play equipment and you'll find us in the green pavilion facing the main field. For users of What3Words just type in: novelist.thin.tint.

It's a simple concept - we take in new, or good as new, clothing, shoes and accessories, selling these on. 50% of the sale price is allocated to the person who donated the items, with the other 50% going towards village funds. This form of income helps to fund items such as the play equipment and other parish purchases.

Alongside clothing for men, women and children we have a good selection of books plus have expanded our range to include homewares. All non-clothes items are sold with 100% of monies to village funds.

At the end of the season we hold a sale event, making our bargains even cheaper! Leftover stock gets cleared ready for the new items and recently the winter stock, with good quality warm clothing for men, women and children, was donated to help the people fleeing Ukraine.

#### Fifty Years of Brownies (1972-2022)

In 1969, I finished my teacher training and started my career as a Primary School teacher. My first appointment was at Bacton Primary School where I stayed for 5 years. At that time teachers were expected to take on voluntary roles within the community. Today this is very difficult because the workload of a teacher is far greater than it was in the 60s, 70s, or even the 80s. Once a year, I helped with the Mendlesham Pensioners' Christmas party as its secretary and also preparing foods and serving at the tables. However, I wanted to do more within the community and considered setting up a Saturday morning creative group for young children or perhaps a Saturday Playgroup. But at that time Playgroups were becoming popular and a meeting was held in the old village hall and it was decided to run a playgroup for 3 to 5 years olds on Tuesday and Thursday mornings which meant with my teaching commitments I was unable to assist. Then a colleague at school told me about her role as a Ranger Guider within the Stowmarket Ranger Guide unit. I became very interested and volunteered to help at several Brownie Packs within the Stowmarket and Haughley District over the next 2 years. Finally, I went on a residential course for Guiders at Hengrave Hall near Bury St Edmunds.

Now I was ready to set up my own Brownie Pack. Ideal as Mendlesham did not have any Guiding units within the village. My next task was to find a willing helper. Fortunately my then sister-in-law, Val Baker (now Lawes) agreed to be my Tawny Owl. So on the 7<sup>th</sup> June 1972 we held our first Brownie Pack meeting in the Old School Room when 11 girls came along to join. These girls were -Christine and Pauline Woods, Kathryn Sives, Louise and Wendy Squirrell, Mary and Wendy Steward, Michelle Dove, Sally Sanders, Susan Foster and Valerie Briggs. A sub paid at that time was the princely total of 3 pence per girl. By the end of July, 3 more girls had joined us - Karen Murphy, Karen Talbot and Sadie Tomkins. At that time the girls were divided into 3 Sixes – Elves, Pixies and Gnomes. My sister Jennie Lummis also came along to help us as a Unit Helper. By the end of the year we had 20 girls on our books. As a full pack was 24 girls we were now feeling that this was a very worthwhile and successful commitment. We planned many exciting meetings covering the 8 points of the Guiding programme whereby the girls learnt to be wide awake, to keep fit, to do their best, to make things, to be friendly, to lend a hand and to help at home. There were many interest badges which they could work for as well taking part in district concerts, entertaining at the Pensioner's party, inter pack sports, camp fire singing, Maypole dancing at the Street Favre, a Maori concert whereby the girls sang a Maori love song with actions, performed a Poi dance and the Maori stick game, and of course activities whereby money was raised for the pack and various charities.

I was Brown Owl with the 1<sup>st</sup> Mendlesham Pack for 30 years and retired in 2002 after having served 7 years as District Commissioner for the Haughley District. During my time as Brownie Guider (Brown Owl), I had several willing helpers, Tawny Owls and Snowy Owls. In fact, the Pack could not have run without them.

For several years Maureen Clark and her daughter Gillian helped. Maureen did go on to open the Guide Company in the village with Elizabeth Creegan. Brenda Hunt, Paulette Hammond, Hannah Smith, Lorraine and Tracey Welham were also helpers giving up their free time. Dorothy Froude stood in when Val Lawes retired until she took over the Guide Company. When Dorothy left I was so lucky that Brenda Stannard already a Guider, moved into Mendlesham and stepped in to be my Tawny Owl and Angela Cole volunteered as Snowy Owl so for several years we made a great partnership taking Brownies on 9 Pack Holidays which we ran every 18 months. We took away total of 18 Brownies each time to Felixstowe (five times), Shotley, Woodbridge, Sutton and Hengrave Hall. We had a great team of helpers – Jodi and Sue Palmer, Dorothy and her mother (Mrs Allen), Olive Peel and Cheryll Elmer.

With a flourishing Brownie Pack in the village it was good to have a Guide Company and a Rainbow Unit to complete the Guiding family. We have had several girls coming back over the years to help within these units as Young Leaders which does help them when applying for a job or entrance into University or looking for personal development opportunities. They are able to show they have leadership skills and are capable of organising activities. Today, Brenda Stannard and Emma Munday (Kathryn Sives' daughter) run the Brownie Pack and also the Guide Company. The Rainbow Unit is run by Becky Froude with Katharine Robinson (my daughter) as the unit helper. These leaders are devoted and trained volunteers who have given up their free time to give young girls fun, guidance on making friendships and how to be kind to others and also educating them about the world we live in.

I have very fond memories of my time as a Brownie Guider. There are lots of stories to tell of times during a Pack Holiday especially when the girls did not get off to sleep until past midnight. Also, many hours were spent planning the meetings, trying our best to give the girls a fun time and playing a part in organising District events or a Pack outing. If there is anyone who would like to help with any Unit meetings or think they might like to do leadership training just speak to Brenda Stannard, Emma Munday or Becky Froude because Girl guiding does need willing, committed and dedicated helpers.

On 5<sup>th</sup> June we also have the Churches Birthday, Pentecost which is the festival of the windy, fiery Spirit of God, perhaps the most imaginative of all the Christian festivals, which is on the 50th day after Easter (in Greek Pentecost).

We remember that the Holy Spirit came down upon the apostles, and filled the early Church with the Spirit, they began to speak in many languages and shared with others the great things God had done, and that is how the church was born, after that many believed and started to meet for prayers and teaching, sharing life together and breaking bread.

In many Churches and traditions, this is the time when we remind ourselves that the Church is called to mission, to sharing with others the good news of Jesus Christ – in word and in deed.

Perhaps this year we do need to celebrate particularly with all that we have been through, remembering that God walks with us in both in Joy and sorrow.

#### **Fr Philip Writes..**

**St Mark's Gospel has two endings:** The original Gospel ends abruptly at chapter 16 v 8... **"And the women came out and ran away** 

from the tomb because they were frightened out of their wits; and they said nothing to a soul, for they were afraid." The 12 verses which now finish the Gospel are considered by scholars to be a slightly later addition by another person than Mark. At Theological college we rather wrote off verses 15-20 because of that, but we actually have very important lessons to learn from them. They read as follows:

'And he said to them, 'Go out to the whole world; proclaim the gospel to all creation. Whoever believes and is baptised will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned.

These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.'

And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven; there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it.'

Perhaps Mark's original point was that we should all fill in the story of

the Risen Christ in our lives, as quite clearly the women did say something to other people or nobody, including ourselves, would ever have heard about the Resurrection. In the rest of his Gospel Mark had described what



Jesus did in his public ministry as a prelude to what he continues to do now through the church. So what do we learn from the concluding section?

- The Church has the task of <u>SPREADING THE GOOD NEWS</u>. It is the duty of the Church – and that means every Christian- to tell the story of the Good News of Jesus to those who have never heard it. One recent Pope said there are 8 Sacraments of the Church: the 8<sup>th</sup> is the lives of Christians, which should be signs of God's grace. One prayer we say at Morning Prayer is: 'Help us to manifest your resurrection by our way of living.'
- The Church has the task of <u>HEALING</u>. Christianity is concerned with people's bodies as well as their minds and spirits. Jesus came to bring health to the body, mind and spirit.



- 3. The Church should be a <u>CHURCH OF POWER</u>. In the colourful language of venomous snakes and poisonous liquids is a conviction that the Christian is filled with a power to cope with life.
- 4. The Church <u>WILL NEVER BE LEFT ALONE</u>. Always, Christ works with it, in it and through it in preaching, teaching and healing, particularly through the laying on of hands and anointing of the sick with oil.

The Good News of Easter and Pentecost is that Jesus wants to work a miracle in us if we open our hearts to him. Please ask yourself: "What miracle do I want Jesus to work in me?" You have only to read the Acts of the Apostles to see a remarkable parallel between the life of the early Church and the life of Jesus. Jesus healed and so did the early Church. Jesus expelled evil spirits and so did the early Church. The Church is the extension of Jesus in space and time and at St Mary's we are here to fulfil these words: "God sends no churches from the skies: out of our hearts they must arise."

I pray these words may be fulfilled in our parish.
