### **Referendum Information Statement**

A referendum on the Mendlesham Neighbourhood Plan 2018 - 2037 will be held on Thursday 17 November 2022. The 'Mendlesham Neighbourhood Plan 2018 - 2037' has been prepared to update and replace the plan that was first adopted by Mid Suffolk District Council in March 2017. The original policies are retained, some are updated, and there is a new policy that relates specifically to residential development proposals.

There is a statutory process which must be followed before this updated Neighbourhood Plan can be 'made' (adopted). That involves holding a new referendum, which is conducted in accordance with procedures similar to those used at local government elections. Those entitled to vote will be asked to answer 'yes' or 'no' to the following question:

### 'Do you want Mid Suffolk District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Mendlesham to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?'

If more than 50% vote 'yes', then Mid Suffolk District Council will be legally obliged to 'make' (adopt) this neighbourhood plan as part of its development plan framework.

A person is entitled to vote in the referendum if;

• He or She is entitled to vote in a local government election in the referendum area; and

• He or She has an address at which they are registered to vote within the referendum area and are over the age of 18 years on the date of poll.

The referendum area is identical to that which was originally designated as the Neighbourhood Plan Area, and follows the parish boundary. A map can be found within the referendum version of the Plan (see link further below).

Expenses can be incurred by an individual or body during the referendum period for referendum purposes but are subject to a limit calculated to be £2,431.21 The number of persons entitled to vote in the referendum by reference to which that limit has been calculated is 1,173

#### What does the Mendlesham Neighbourhood Development Plan Modification offer you?

It gives you, the residents, a voice in the future of the parish. It contains new and updated local policies that will help shape our local community.

If adopted, it becomes part of the statutory planning framework for this parish, and will be used by Mid Suffolk District Council when it makes decisions on future planning applications.

What do the policies aim to do? Keep the parish as a rural community Support new development that is suitable for our rural environment Provide additional affordable housing Support small local business development Protect our historic environment Provide guidance for building design requirements Provide High speed broadband. Maintain and improve our green areas and open spaces Maintain and improve our Public Rights of Way and countryside access

If the plan is adopted the parish will continue to receive 25% of the developer's contributions collected by Mid Suffolk District Council through the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL). This money can then be used to further improve our local services and environment.



### Annex A to Ed Fn meeting 21st September 2022 Mendlesham Educational Foundation

Recently there was an article in the newsletter regarding a Mendlesham Parish Charity, the Church and Town Estate, however, another charity exists called the Mendlesham Educational Foundation. Mendlesham Educational Foundation was established by the will of Henry Jessop in 1556. The charity seeks to support the educational needs of the Parish of Mendlesham, and has over time been modified to account for changes in educational needs.

The "Scheme" a document modified in 1982 and sealed in September 1983 outlines how the Mendlesham Educational Foundation should be constructed and operate. The scheme states that the:

"Trustees shall apply the income of the Charity in promoting education (including social and physical training).... In promoting the education of persons under the age of 21 (this was changed in 1991 to under 25) who or whose parents are resident in the Parish of Mendlesham and who are in need of financial assistance. The awards are to such persons scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries, maintenance allowance or grants tenable at any school, university, college of education or other institution of further (including professional and technical) education approved by the trustees". The scheme also allows for support to voluntary organisations within the parish or neighbourhood providing social and physical training, this would include groups such as the scouting and guiding movements.

The charities income is from dividends on investments, rent from land and property (Old School Room and Old School House) and donations. The investment portfolio is managed by an independent financial advisor who maintains close contact with the trustees with regular financial updates. Of course the funds are not limitless and it remains the duty of the Trustees to ensure longevity of the scheme, by financial management. Awards made will be made with regard to the Foundations financial situation at that time, the trustees will also adjust the amount of an award offered accordingly. All applications are reviewed by the Trustees and if an award is agreed payment will be made by cheque to the recipient.

The large proportion of awards each year are made to students attending educational establishments across the country, the list below demonstrates the awards made over the last 10 years to student education in the parish.

In addition to supporting students, village youth organisations, Mendlesham Primary School and individuals with special educational needs have all been supported each year. Total donations vary from year to year with the average support given totalling between £25,000 and £35,000 each year.

The annual report is presented at the Parish Meeting and submitted to the Charity Commission annually.







### Father Philip writes...

"You must stand ready, because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect."

I have written about prayer for the departed for many years in the

month of November, which is dedicated to prayer for the dead. I have never written on being prepared for our own death. We do not know what lies around the next bend on the road of life. At death we leave everything behind and set out for a new existence, relying only on God's promise. His call is to be faithful to God and one another in spite of our setbacks and failures We should draw courage and hope from St Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa) who said, "God has not called me to be successful. He called me to be faithful."



Death is the greatest event in life, yet it catches many people unawares. To some it comes literally like a thief in the night, but the call of Jesus is to **BE PREPARED**. Every morning I say the words from the hymn: "Lord, for tomorrow and its needs I do not pray. keep me, my God, from stain of sin just for today. And



if today my tide of life should ebb away, give me Thy Sacraments divine, Sweet Lord, today."... and each evening, at Night Prayer: "May the Lord grant us a quiet night and a perfect end." and I commend this to you.

One day a monk was sweeping the floor in the monastery and someone asked hm what he would do if he knew he was going to die within the hour. He replied: "I would make the sign of the Cross and go in sweeping the floor." In other

words, he would go on attending to the duty of the moment.

So how are we to prepare for death? It is essential to be at peace with God and our neighbours. In Wednesday's Night Prayer, there is the following short Scripture reading: "Do not let resentment lead you into sin; the sunset must not find you angry. Do not give the devil his opportunity." (Ephesians 4 v 26-

27) We should get our lives in order now.

There is a fable about 3 student devils preparing to go to earth and their teacher asked what strategy they had decided to get people to sin. The first devil said: *"I'll tell people there is <u>no God</u>. Enjoy life."* 

The second devil said: "I'll tell people there is <u>no hell</u>. Enjoy life."



The third devil said: *"I'll tell people there is <u>no hurry</u>. Enjoy life."* The teacher said to the third devil, *"Well done: that is the best reply."* 

Someone else wrote: "I can't be prepared for death too soon, because I can't be sure when too soon will be too late." At Morning Prayer we are reminded: "Today, if you would listen to his voice, harden not your hearts." May we live each day with the intention of being at peace with God and our neighbours and be ready to meet Christ either at our death or the end of time.
