#### **Parish Council:**

#### Fly Tipping and Anti Social behaviour:

Over the weekend of 3 and 4 September, Mendlesham Playingfields was the subject of antisocial behaviour including noise, bins moved and litter that had to be picked up.

The Police attended further to a 999 call.

There were also two separate incidents of fly tipping, at other locations around Mendlesham village.

Thank you to the residents who reported these matters to the Parish Council, Police and Mid Suffolk District Council Cleansing Department.

Please note investigations are ongoing and we hope that those responsible will be found and penalised accordingly. In the Crown Court the maximum penalty is **5 years jail and/or an unlimited fine**. In the magistrates' court, persons convicted of fly-tipping can be fined an unlimited amount, jailed for 12 months, or sent to The Crown Court for more severe penalties.

Making home improvements can be stressful, but there are a few steps you can follow to help it go smoothly.

First, find a Trading Standards 'approved trader'. It's also worth checking if they're a current member of a trade body. Trade bodies have codes of practice and can help resolve problems if things go wrong. Ask who they're registered with and then check the trade body's website.

For any gas and electric fixes, only use certified traders - it's dangerous to use someone who doesn't know what they're doing. You can check the Gas Safe Register at gassaferegister.co.uk for a list of traders and use a registered electrician from electricalcompetentperson.co.uk who can certify their own work.

It's always helpful to get references or recommendations where possible. Ask your friends, family or neighbours if they know of anyone they'd recommend. You can also ask the person you hire for examples of work they've carried out in the past. Try to avoid contractors who won't give references - it's a sign they could be dishonest.

When you find someone, ask for a written quote - this is different to an estimate. A quote is legally binding and the tradesperson can't change it without a good reason - for example, if you ask for extra work to be done. It's worth comparing quotes from several contractors to make sure you're getting a fair price.

Next, get a written contract. This should cover exactly what you're paying for and everything you've agreed on, including timings, payments, who will pay for materials and any subcontractors if needed. When it comes to payment, it's best to opt to pay in stages rather than upfront. Try to pay by card if you can - this can give you extra safeguards if something goes wrong.


Finally, make sure your trader is fully insured. Keep copies of receipts and your written contract. These will be important as evidence if things go wrong. It's also helpful to take photos of any problems if they arise.





We plough the fields, and scatter the good seed on the land, but it is fed and watered by God's almighty hand: he sends the snow in winter, the warmth to swell the grain, the breezes and the sunshine, and soft refreshing rain.

At this time of year, in churches and schools our thoughts turn to Harvest festivals, and the singing of our favourite Harvest Hymns, and woe betide a minister if they do not include a particular harvest hymn. One harvest hymn that I would call a Marmite hymn because it is loved or hated in equal measures, I have had equal complaints, whether I have had it at a harvest service or not, the hymn "We plough the fields and scatter". The hymn comes from Germany, Written by poet Matthias Claudius, "and was published in 1782 and set to tune Wir pflugen in 1800 by Johann A. P. Schulz. It was translated into English by Jane Montgomery Campbell in 1861.

In 1777, Matthias Claudius had become ill and returned to Christianity after leaving it in his 20s. During his illness he wrote a number of poems which, "We plough the fields and scatter" was one of them. In 1782, a friend invited him over for dinner and asked him to bring one of the Christian poems he had written. It is said to have been based on <u>Psalm 144</u> and originally had 17 verses. The poem was then published as a peasant's song.

From there, it was published across <u>Germany</u> in a number of hymnbooks. The majority of these cut down on the original 17 verses with the publishers often deciding to start with the 3rd verse which started with "We Plough The Fields And Scatter".

In 1862 in England, <u>Jane Montgomery Campbell</u>, who was proficient in the German language, started to translate a number of German hymns into English. She translated the hymn into English as "We Plough the Fields and Scatter"; however, she did not make a strict translation from the original German but ensured retention of the hymn's original focus of giving thanks to God for the harvest. She taught the hymn to the children at the <u>Church of England</u> parish school in London where her father was the <u>rector</u>. (Perhaps this is why not everyone likes it as we had to sing it so many times as school and even church harvest services.)

Today this hymn is predominantly used as a hymn to give thanks to God for the harvest. This year our harvest may not be as abundant as usual with the lack of rain but we still have a lot to be thankful for.

## Father Philip writes...

This Summer has been a challenge to the Friends of St Mary's. As I wrote in an article in the

September newsletter, the Architect's Quinquennial Report highlighted roof trouble: 1) a split in the lead on the nave roof. This will have to be repaired, but for some time we have known the whole of the nave roof



will have to be re-leaded. 2) the roof to the armoury (north porch) has 2 large splits in the lead and will have to be renewed as soon as possible. I am grateful to Chris Elstone and Graham Baker for the temporary work they have done to prevent further damage. We are also going to need some

electrical work done; it is over 35 years since the church was rewired. Fire extinguishers also need renewing. We need to raise £20,000 as quickly as possible – hence the Friends are arranging many fundraisers over the next months. Please contact the chairman, Jean Martin, or secretary, Amanda King, if you would like a

collecting box.

In the book of Genesis, Jacob wakes from a dream in which he has a vision of angels ascending to God and says,

"How awesome is this place!
This is none other than the House
of God and the Gate of Heaven!"

Having found this place,

Bethel, he kept going back to it, as did his children for generations. Their focus was the big stone Jacob had set up, anointed and called 'The House of God'. The stone was the place where God was at home with Jacob and Jacob was at home with God. It was Jacob's place of security.

One of the great features of St Mary's Mendlesham is that so many people find a home there. It is a place to feel uplifted and enabled to face life. The building, its statues, its candles and incense are there to celebrate God being at home with us and we with him.

Unlike Jacob, we have no need to go to historical spots like Bethlehem or Calvary, because Jesus is present in every Mass and his Sacramental Body is reserved in the Tabernacle. St Mary's is a Eucharistic Church – Mass is offered daily. Here God meets his pilgrim people and leads them onwards. St Mary's is a place where we can make ourselves at home in the Sacrament of Reconciliation – returning home with the same



welcome as the Prodigal Son. St Mary's is a building to bring us to our knees, because prayer exudes from its stones. I believe the architecture, daily worship and presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacarament, together with the reservation of the oils for the sick all add up to a place of which the poet TS Eliot wrote in 'Little

Gidding': "You are not here to verify, Instruct yourself, or inform curiosity Or carry report. You are here to kneel Where prayer has been valid."

It is not unnatural or strange to lift our hearts and minds to God in this place. That is why in or around 1200 the Bishop anointed the walls of the church with holy oil to be set apart for ever. Please give generously so we can continue to maintain what has been here for over 800 years for future generations.
