The club for young people finished sometime ago and the Adult Club is now self supporting but we continue to operate to raise funds for village organisations and because we enjoy providing an important service to our friends and neighbours. So we have decided to change our name to Mendlesham Community Café to reflect what is our main function. We have an amazing team of committed volunteers who all enjoy providing coffee, cakes and very reasonably priced lunches to our regulars and new customers. All the food is home cooked and served in what is always a happy and lively atmosphere.

We are back on Saturday 4th February at the Old School Rooms. We look forward to seeing you then and any first Saturday of each month.

Parish Council: Mendlesham Community Centre: Sale and New Build

Further to previous communications, Mendlesham Parish Council as trustee for Mendlesham Community Centre Charity and Mendlesham Memorial Playing Fields Charity are now able to provide residents with an update further to the proposal to sell the parts of Mendlesham Community Centre owned by Mendlesham Community Centre Charity and build a new community building on land owned by Mendlesham Memorial Playing fields Charity to the rear of the Wheeled Sports Area.

You may recall that in early 2021, Suffolk County Council approached the Community Centre Trustee with an offer to purchase the areas of the Community Centre owned by the Charity. This was to facilitate the much-needed SEND unit now located in what was the Small Hall and welcomed by the Trustees and after consultation the community, as a one off opportunity to sell the Charity areas and use the sale proceeds towards the cost of a new standalone building, fit for community purposes, which would be available to users more often rather than solely outside school times.

One of the first requirements was to obtain permission from Fields in Trust to sell the building and build new. This has taken much of last year, but we have now obtained that permission.

We now need to obtain permission from the Charity Commission. After seeking legal advice, our plan is to:

1. Request to merge the Mendlesham Community Centre and Mendlesham Memorial Playing Fields charities, which will simplify the administration of both charities including the legal/financial processes to enable the new build.

2. Request permission to sell the existing Charity owned parts of Mendlesham Community Centre building to provide sale proceeds towards the costs of a new building.


At the time of writing, we are waiting confirmation of the details, but understand the two separate consultations will need to cover a two month period, at the end of which, a public meeting will be held to ask for residents to vote on both questions.

We plan to hold the consultations for the months of February and March 2023, with the public meeting to vote on the two proposals to take place on Tuesday 18 April 2023 Mendlesham Main Hall, the same night as the planned Parish Meeting.

Please therefore look out for further information on the Parish Notice Boards and E News. We will also provide updates via the paper newsletter, subject to timescales of events and publication/delivery dates. More information will be shortly available and we would very much welcome your thoughts, support and the opportunity of discussing any questions you may have.

Once the consultations have been successfully concluded and permission obtained from the Charity Commission, we will then be able to appoint an Architect and plan the new building in more detail.

Madagascar Marine Mishap

Whilst on detachment in Madagascar, my mate, an experienced yachtsman, invited to go sailing with him and in my naivety, I thought it might be fun. Dressed in just our swimming short, shirts and sandals we headed to the yacht club and boarded a 20ft catamaran.

Mark explained and demonstrated the fundamentals of yachting such as coming about, tacking, boom, mainstay and rudder (I knew that one - aeroplanes have them!)

We were soon gliding towards the open sea. It was an ideal day for yachting with a warm light offshore wind. We turned to starboard past the end of the mole and began a run 100 yards out along the mile-long beach towards a wide river mouth at the other end.

After about an hour we were in the process of coming about adjacent to the river mouth when, with a crack like a gunshot, the starboard mainstay snapped and disappeared over the side, taking with it the mast, sail and everything connected to it.

We grabbed the port mainstay in an attempt to pull the wreckage aboard but the sail was acting like an anchor and the tangled mass was slowly sinking.

"No worries" shouted Mark, "I'll get it" and promptly dived over the side into the sea which in that part of the world hosts a number of rather large bity and stingy things – so there was no way I was going to join him.continued from page 12

Eventually we managed to haul the wreckage aboard and I was pleased to see that Mark was still in one piece. However, the wind had blown us about 400 yards off shore and into the outflow from the river, exacerbating our problem.

The incoming tide was creating 3ft high waves along the steeply sloping shore and we now had less than an hour of daylight left. We had no life jackets, flares or radio, just a pair of oars but no rowlocks in which to secure them – so much for experience.

With all our strength, much urgency, a surfeit of adrenalin and a considerable amount of swearing we paddled out stricken vessel towards the far bank of the river. Then grabbed the mooring rope and set off to cross the mouth of the river that was now back flowing with the incoming tide.

Wading chest deep across the 150-yard wide, flowing river mouth, hauling a heavy wooden catamaran with a mind of its own was not funny; we eventually pulled the stricken craft up onto the beach where we collapsed just as the sun dipped into the horizon.

We then battled to drag the boat out of the water, bobbing and weaving in the crashing waves. With one last massive effort and fortunately, the generous help of a couple of local guys, we heaved the catamaran up above the high-water mark and secured it to the sea wall.

We slept well that night and returned the following morning. We collected the club's motor launch and towed the catamaran back to its original mooring for essential repairs.

What an introduction to yachting that was - never again!

citizens advice Mid Suffolk Mid Suffolk Our tenancy agreement isn't up for eight months, what can I do?

It's good that you've already raised the issue with your letting agency. Unfortunately, it isn't always easy to work out the cause of mould or damp This can make it difficult to work out if your landlord is responsible, unless there's an obvious cause, like a leaking roof.

There are many causes of damp that properties can get. The most common are rising, penetrating, construction and condensation damp. On our website there is information that may help you work out what type of damp you have, who is responsible and what you can do. Check your tenancy agreement too for mentions of repairs and damp, and reach out to Citizens Advice on anything you're unsure about.

A landlord will have to act in relation to damp if it makes the property unsafe for someone to live in. This could be for example, if it is making the tenant or a member of their family ill. The landlord will also be responsible if the damp is related to repairs they should have carried out, like if heaters are broken. If the damp has damaged items that the landlord is responsible for, such as carpets and window frames, they'll likely have to cover the cost of repairs.

One of the most common causes of damp is condensation. To prevent this, it's important to keep homes well-heated and well-ventilated, but for a lot of people this will be trickier to do given the colder weather and higher heating costs. You may be eligible for help to insulate and heat your home, and should visit our website to find out more.


On our website we also have advice on things that can make damp worse and may impact the landlord taking responsibility for repairs. These include drying clothes on heaters or blocking air vents.

If your landlord is responsible for the damp in your property but doesn't act, there are steps you can take, such as reporting them to the local authority. If you're in social housing you might also be able to use the landlord's formal complaints procedure. There is more information about this on our website. If it reaches the point where you want to get out of a fixed term tenancy agreement early, speak to Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk first, as there might be better ways to approach the issue. 





Fr Philip Writes

Over the past couple of months, Mendlesham has suffered the loss of several parishioners. It seems to

have been a time of one funeral after another and for the bereaved it has understandably been a harrowing time.

We are used to hearing the familiar words of the ancient prophet Isaiah at Christmass about the coming of a great light through the birth of a special child. The Church has always believed this child to be Jesus, who was proclaimed 40 days after his birth by the old man Simeon as the "Light of the World". I am often asked why people die despite the fact we have prayed for their healing. My mind goes back to the days I taught Religious Education at a Grammar School. I thought the boys should experience God's nearness and the prayers of the Blessed Virgin Mary at the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham (which, many years later, was voted the nation's most favourite spiritual place by BBC Radio 4 listeners). I told the boys who were unable to go that we would offer prayers for anyone who was sick, as it it is a shrine specially noted for healing. One boy in the third year said his mother had had a severe heart attack and I promised prayers for her healing. The day after we returned from Walsingham, where we had offered these prayers, the boy came to the staffroom door and told me his mother had died. I was devastated and wondered what I could say to a boy of his age. I need not have worried; he



said to me that she had been healed. The doctor had told his family that the heart attack had been so severe that if she had come round from it she would have been in a vegatitive state. God had healed her in the best way possible – a healing death.

As Lent approaches we need to consider exactly what prayer is. It is like plugging a lamp cord into an electrical socket. Plugging the cord into the socket doesn't create the electrical power: it simply makes contact with it to enable the current to flow from the outlet, through the cord, into the lamp. It is the same with prayer. Prayer doesn't create divine power but enables it to flow from Jesus, the Light of the World through us, into the lives of other people. Prayer is answered, but often not in the way we have wanted, as I learnt from that school pupil.

This following 'Prayer of an Unknown Soldier' may help shed light on the mystery of prayer:

I asked for *strength* that I might *achieve*; I was made *weak* that I might *learn humbly to obey*.

I asked for *health* that I might do *greater things*; I was given *infirmity* that I might do *better things*.

I asked for *riches* that I might be *happy*; I was given *poverty* that I might be *wise*.

I asked for power that I might have the praise of men;

I was given weakness that I might feel the need of God.

I asked for **all things** that I might **enjoy life**; I was given *life* that I might **enjoy all things**.

I got nothing I had asked for, but everything I had hoped for.

Almost, despite myself, my unspoken prayers were answered.

I am, of all men, most richly blessed!
