# MENDLESHAM PARISH COUNCIL

### Parish Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer (part time)

Mendlesham Parish Council invites applications for the varied and rewarding post of Parish Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer.

In your role as Parish Clerk and RFO you will be an employee of the Parish Council, responsible to the Parish Council as a whole and implementing the decisions that result from its meetings.

The post requires attendance at all meetings (generally one evening a month), organising, preparing and publicising meetings, minuting and publishing minutes, providing and publishing financial statements, administration and responsibility for all finances and submitting to internal and External Auditors each year, managing the Parish Council website together with all general administrative tasks and ensuring that all business is within the legal requirements set for Local Government. The role also requires administration of the Community Centre Charity and the Playing-fields Charity to which the Parish Council is sole Trustee to both.

The role is mainly home based and supports flexible working of a minimum 840 hours per annum (70 hours per month). Pay and annual leave will be in line with NALC guidelines. Salary is dependent on experience and qualifications and will be within the SCP 16-22 grading ( $\pounds$ 13.70 -  $\pounds$ 15.30 per hour). This will be reviewed after a successful 6-month probationary period.

The successful candidate will be able to show they have good interpersonal, organisational, communication, IT and numeracy skills. A good understanding of basic accounting, Word and Excel is essential.

A CiLCA qualification would be an advantage but not a necessity as training and support will be provided including commencing CiLCA training within 12 months of starting in the role if not already qualified.

Starting date will be negotiable and will allow for briefing and handover from our current Clerk.

### Mendlesham Educational Foundation - Volunteer Trustees Wanted

The Mendlesham Educational Foundation are seeking a number of new trustees to replace existing trustees who have already retired. The role is purely voluntary, is not arduous, with meetings taking place only four times per year, some running decisions and discussions are made electronically. However, it is a very rewarding role helping to support youth groups and education within the parish up to the age of 25. The role would suit anyone with a willingness and interest to contribute to the community. In particular the trustees are looking to increase the existing skill set to include volunteers with a medical background or parents with younger children, although this is not a prerequisite for volunteering, just a wish list.

#### History and How the Charity Operates.

The Mendlesham Educational Charity was founded in 1516 by the will of Henry Jessop. The income for the charity is from dividends on investments, rent from land gifted to the charity over time, and a small income from the hiring of the Old School Room. This annual income is used to benefit the young of Mendlesham under the age of 25, by offering grants for 16-25 year olds in part-time or full-time education, youth groups benefit such as Scouting and Guiding, Football. These grants are applied for annually open to anyone living in the parish, and are granted at the discretion of the trustees. The amount awarded is dependent on a number of criteria, primarily the current financial situation of the Charity at the time of the awards.

To put some substance on the grants awarded:

In 2022/23 grants were awarded to 29 students ( $\pounds$ 17,035), 8 Youth Groups ( $\pounds$ 2400), Mendlesham Primary School ( $\pounds$ 8400) and other individual specialist awards.

In 2009 grants were made to 46 students attending further education in college or university, 11 village youth groups, Primary School, Toddler Group and towards paint for the St Joseph's Centre. A total of £33,040 was distributed in 2009 with 2010 being very similar.

Harriet was born in Ixworth. She was married, had four children and they lived on the Oakley Estate under the care of Sir Edward. He was good to his poor residents. Harriet lost her husband and a fourteen year old son and she gained an adopted daughter called Agnes.

She administered to the sick, although not the most healthy herself as she suffered colds every month. Harriet helped all the poor, made clothes, took them to the station when they had to travel but mainly attended the sick. Although she would not attend those with cholera. She helped those from surrounding areas as well. She would sit with the dying, attend those in childbirth and help when there was an epidemic of measles and so forth. All along with looking after her own brood. She died at the age of 61 and although they called her the Angel of Hexton there has never been a memorial for her.



Mendlesham Parish Council have been authorised to proceed and co-opt a new Parish Councillor further to the vacancy since the May 2023 elections.

- Registered to vote in the area or have lived, worked, or owned property there for at least 12 months before an election.



### Church Bells

The sound of church bells is considered by many to be a pleasant part of life in England, for example imagine playing bowls or cricket on a sunny evening hearing the bells ringing in the background. The 'Music' is created by pulling bells full circle up and down the ringing order changing by one place at a time to a defined sequence which is known as a 'method' or it's called by a conductor. Bellringing is a team activity that stimulates the brain and helps keep you fit... it also makes a glorious sound! It is an exercise for the body and the mind for people from all walks of life, men, women and children ranging in age from about 10 to 90. It involves concentration and application. It is about technique, not strength. Many consider ringing to be their contribution to church life, calling people to worship, others do it for the pure pleasure it brings. In Suffolk ringing is presided over by The Suffolk Guild of Ringers with a Guild Management Committee and a Ringing Master (male or female). You can join once you have learned how to ring 'rounds'. There is a thriving, well run website, www.Suffolkbells.org.uk. - "you name it, it is on there". Similar organisations govern the art area by area throughout the UK. The Guild President is the Diocesan Bishop, The Rt Revd Martin Seeley, supported by a distinguished list of Vice Presidents including the Bishop of Dunwich and over 600 bell ringers. In the UK the controlling body is the Central Council for Church Bell Ringers whose meetings include representatives from Suffolk and similar associations throughout the country. There is a national weekly magazine (A4) called 'The Ringing World' with a superb cover embodying a photograph competition of church scenes and a short write up inside, by a local person describing it. Suffolk is divided into four districts. NE(ast), SE, SW and NW. All have a Chairman, Ringing Master and Committee. There are monthly events including visits to other towers, competitions and social events. Churches which have bells generally have their own Band of Ringers which often include husband, wife and family members. Any ringer can visit another tower and is welcomed openly, 'good evening what would you like to ring!' Ringing Bands become a 'family'.

On problems with oak bell frames: The principle destructive agents of oak belfry structures are wet rot and death watch beetle. Ventilation is usually sufficient to inhibit the spread of dry rot. Wet rot softens the timber which is then prone to beetle attack. Joints are especially vulnerable and beetle larvae eat away the dowels and heartwood joints which then become further loosened and damaged by movement caused by ringing bells.

#### Stowmarket District Lightweight Hike Competition



This is an annual competition held on the 7/8th October. The start point was Otley Scout HQ and there were 13 teams representing six Troops from the District.

The Scouts hiked 12.4kms to Debenham Sports Centre on day one. Day 2 they hiked 11.6km for a circular hike back to Debenham Sports Centre. They camped at the Sports Centre. #### Preparation for this competition

Over a couple of weeks on Troop nights, the Scouts were given the checkpoints and grid references. They then had to plot their route on OS Explorer maps, calculate the distance, times and compass bearings between checkpoints and then allocate arrival times at the checkpoints and the destinations. The Scouts had to carry all their kit in rucksacks. Clothing, tents, food, cooking equipment, sleeping bags and mats.

#### <u>Results</u>

Each team were allocated points for their route cards, timings, bag packing, meals, tent and site cleanliness, teamwork and attitude.

This was their 3rd attempt with the same members, that is why they called themselves '3rd Time Lucky' and so they were, by winning the competition. They will be presented with the shield in the next few weeks.

We also had an Assisted Team (2 adults walked with them, but the Scouts had to do all the work themselves) of 4 new Scouts, one having moved up from Cubs just a few weeks ago. They did the same preparation with a bit more help from the Leaders. They also only carried their personal kit. I am pleased to say,

they finished joint 7th, so an amazing achievement for a group of young Scouts who have never experienced this before.

#### **Citizens** advice Mid Suffolk A family has moved into the house next door and is being a nuisance, yelling late at night over a loud television and leaving bin bags strewn over the front of the house. I don't want to antagonise them in case they become threatening. What can I do?

Anti social behaviour (ASB) can have a big impact on someone's quality of life, so we can understand how frustrating this situation must be.

You could try to resolve problems by speaking with your neighbour, if it's safe to do so. Explain the effect their behaviour is having and ask them to stop. If the problem continues, keep a record of incidents, which will come in handy if you decide to take the matter further.

If your neighbour has a landlord, you can ask your neighbour's landlord to speak to them on your behalf. If your neighbour lives in social housing, their landlord should have a policy for dealing with antisocial behaviour.

If you've tried everything but the problem persists, ask for an "Anti Social Behaviour Case Review". You can do this by reporting the issue to the council, the police or a social housing provider. It means these agencies have to work together to find a solution, if the ASB meets the threshold. These agencies have powers to deal with ASB, in ways such as:

- Civil injunctions
- Criminal behaviour orders
- Public space protection orders
- Community protection notices
- Dispersal powers
- Closure powers



At the front of it, Lord Roberts (Field Marshal Frederick Sleigh Roberts, one of Britain's most successful military commanders of the 19th century. He won important victories during the Second Afghan War and revitalised the British campaign in the Boer War), wrote on the 25<sup>th</sup> July 1914,

### Fr Philip Writes .....

November is the month of special prayer for the dead. We read in 2 Maccabees 12 v 43-45: 'Judas,

the leader of the Jews, took a collection from the people individually .... and sent it



to Jerusalem to have a sacrifice for sin offered... in which he took full account of the resurrection. For if he had not expected the fallen to rise again it would have been foolish to pray for the dead... that was why he had this atonement sacrifice offered for the dead, so they might be released from their sin... ' Life does not come to a standstill after physical death. As life goes on, so the need for prayer must also go on. We pray for

all who have died - our family, friends, those who have died unmourned. children miscarried, stillborn, aborted, those who have died in the 2 World Wars and since, those who have no known grave, those who have died by suicide, those who have never had the opportunity to know God's love and forgiveness, those who have died before they could be reconciled with those they have hurt. We are only too aware of how little we know and understand about life beyond the grave. We pray that heaven may be open for them in their journey 'to be changed from glory into glory, till in heaven they take their place.' We pray that all may find freedom to become the people God intends them to be. We must never judge the lives of the dead.

"Rest eternal grant them, Lord, and may light perpetual shine upon them. May they rest in peace."




### Mendlesham's Unique Armoury
