#### Parish Council: Mess Free Mendlesham

Mess Free Mendlesham is a Parish Council project, co-ordinated by Cllrs Denise and Norman Foster, whereby volunteers, normally at the end of each month undertake a litter pick on various highway routes around the Parish. This supports the work undertaken by Parish Council Officer Mark Dixon to litter pick designated routes within Mendlesham Village including Mendlesham Playing fields.

Mess Free Mendlesham has been supported financially by Cllr Andrew Stringer's Mid Suffolk District Council locality grant, local businesses and individuals. Mid Suffolk District Council are also providing assistance to collect the rubbish which is sorted into black and recyclable items by the volunteers and to help fund Mark's role.

Thank you to all involved we are very proud of you.

Since last year the Mess Free project has been extremely successful, growing in the numbers of volunteers helping each time and is now in a position to extend the project to cover more areas, more frequently.

In many ways the success of this work by all concerned is hidden to the rest of us, because litter of so many different types and in large quantities are removed so are not then seen by ourselves. However, we are talking many bags of rubbish, glass, cans and other one-off items each month.

### Mendlesham Welfare Foundation

The first known benefactor of this Mendlesham Charity was Robert Cake. In 1476 his bequest of a150 acre farm in Mendlesham Green was exceedingly generous as the average farm at that time was barely 30 acres. When Robert Cake passed away in 1476, his will was primarily drafted to help fellow taxpayers of Mendlesham lumbered with 10% and 15% tax of their income by Edward IV. Any surplus was to be divided equally between the church and the poor. Over the centuries there have been further gifts of land and property to the trust and various land sold.

## Throughout the last 547 years, this trust has continued to help the people of Mendlesham and Mendlesham Green

September brings a new school year, one of my children is in primary school and the other secondary. Between uniforms, PE kit and knowing they'll need to catch the bus each day the costs are adding up. I'm already pretty stretched, so I'm not sure how to cover these extra outgoings. Is there any help I can get?

A new school year can put pressure on lots of people's budgets, so you're not alone in your worries.

But there is help available. If you are online, a good place to start is the Citizens Advice website at citizensadvice.org.uk/family/education/help-with-school-costs where you'll find lots of information on the support you might be entitled to for school-related costs. The help you can get to cover school lunches will vary depending on how old your children are and if you claim benefits. Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 automatically get free school meals. You can apply for free school meals for older children if you claim certain types of benefits, including Universal Credit, Child Tax Credit and Income Support.

You mentioned concerns about travel costs. If your child can't walk to school because of special educational needs or disabilities they should get free school transport. You may be able to get help with transport costs from Suffolk County Council if your children can't walk because it's dangerous or too far.

If you're on a low income, Suffolk County Council may also be able to help you with activity and school uniform costs. You're likely to be considered to be on a low income if you get means-tested benefits like Universal Credit or Housing Benefit. In some places there are also local charitable schemes that can help. A good place to find out about these is the school itself or Parent Teacher Association (PTA), as both will usually know if these kinds of schemes exist. A lot of people are feeling the squeeze at the moment, but it's important to remember that help is available with school costs and you're not alone.

If you need more information on getting help with school costs, the advisers at Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk will be happy to help.

Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk can provide advice on issues including debt, finances, employment, benefits, family/relationships and more. 



### Fr Philip Writes .....

At St Mary's we have a monthly healing service in obedience to Jesus' command to preach and heal. We live in a society which is disease-conscious, and in

which people love talking about their complaints. Some people seem to take a perverse pleasure in reporting their own and other people's illnesses.

Before we can begin the ministry of healing we must change our way of thinking and get rid of this rubbish which always produces negative feelings. Someone says: *"I have stomach trouble, but it runs in the family and I was told to expect it."* 

As a result he imagines it to be natural and will not <u>expect</u> to be better. We may pray for healing but do we <u>expect</u> Jesus to heal? Charles Allen wrote these words:

"When you say a situation is hopeless, you are slamming the door in the face of God."



I know many people are lonely, sick or bereaved. I suggest it would do us all good to read Matthew 14 v 22-36 in which 'the men in the boat ' - i.e. Jesus' disciples - were

torn between belief and doubt. There was a terrible storm on the sea of Galilee and they saw Jesus walking on the water towards them. They were terrified - believing they were seeing a ghost. Peter said, 'Lord, if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.'

Jesus said, 'Come!' and Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards him... but as soon as Peter took his eyes off Jesus he began to sink.



In the ministry of healing it is essential we keep our eyes on Jesus - and not on our problems. Our mantra should be:

### "Jesus : Jesus only : Jesus always : Jesus in all things"

It is the prayer of FAITH that will save us: Feeling Afraid, I Trust Him. all Trug

Our next healing servie is on Monday 11th Sept at 2.30pm. Unlike so many 'spiritual healers', 'mindfulness courses' or similar - there are no hidden ties at St Mary's and this is freely open to anyone who wishes to come to receive the healing power of Jesus.

The service is quiet and meditative. Nobody will ask you why you have come or what ailments you may have and you can come on behalf of someone else.

Peter was doing fine, even walking on the water towards Jesus, until he noticed how strong the wind was. His fears caused him to

sink. Fear is a great cause of many of the paralyses we experience and is a natural human reaction. Sometimes that is all it takes - a weakening of our trust in ourselves, in others and in God, for anxiety and illness to take over our whole selves. However, although Peter wavered, he knew what to do - he called on Jesus and Jesus saved him from danger.

When things get rough for us, so should we!


