My council tax bill is coming out in March, and I am dreading opening it as it always Mid Suffolk goes up. My income has stayed the same but everything else seems more expensive and I have hardly anything left over - how will I cope if my payments for this year go up?

Many of us are feeling overwhelmed as we see our basic bills and essential costs go up. You're not alone in finding things difficult and, crucially, there's support available.

First off, there are discounts available to some people depending on their circumstances. You can check your bill or contact your council to find out if you might be eligible for an automatic reduction to your council tax.

If you're not getting a discount, you might still be entitled to one. It depends on who lives in the property. So, if you're the only adult in your home, you'll get a 25% discount on your council tax bill.

When working out how many people live in a property, some people aren't counted - they're called 'disregarded people' and include under 18s, a student nurse or someone on an apprenticeship scheme and many more. Checking the government website (https://www.gov.uk/council-tax/who-has-to-pay) for more details. If everyone who lives in the property is disregarded, you will still receive a council tax bill, but it will have a 50% discount. However, if everyone in your home is a student or severely mentally impaired, you won't pay any council tax.

Additionally, if someone has moved out, tell the council as this might change your eligibility. If you are entitled to a discount as a result, it will be valid from the date when the person moved out, even if you told the council after the event, and the reduction may be backdated.

If you think you might be eligible you should apply to your local council for a discount as soon as possible. You can find your council's contact details via https://www.gov.uk/apply-for-council-tax-discount

You mention that your income hasn't increased. If you are on a low income, you might be able to get your council tax reduced. If you get benefits or have other people living with you, this might affect how much your council tax is reduced by.

Your local council will ask you details about your income and your circumstances, so they can work out if you're entitled to a council tax reduction. They will then calculate your new bill and tell you how much council tax you need to pay.

If you have other people living with you who are aged 18 or over, you might all be responsible for paying council tax. Only one of you needs to apply for a council tax reduction. The council will make a decision and reduce the amount of council tax you have to pay accordingly.

You may also be eligible for additional support if you've reached State Pension age which you can check on the government website via

https://www.gov.uk/state-pension-age. If you're under State Pension age, the 'working age rules' apply and if you've reached State Pension age, it depends if you or your partner get certain benefits.

The working age rules still apply if you've reached State Pension age and you or your partner get:

- Universal Credit
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Income Support

If you've reached State Pension age and don't get any of these benefits, the 'pension age rules' apply.

Even if none of the reduction criteria applies to you, your local council can still reduce your council tax bill or cancel it altogether, this is called 'discretionary reduction'. They'll normally only do this if you can show that you're suffering severe hardship and can't afford to pay council tax.

If you're in this situation you should ask your local council for help. You'll need to show them evidence of your circumstances. If your immigration status doesn't let you claim public funds, you can still apply for a discretionary reduction. A discretionary reduction doesn't count as public funds.

We know that times are incredibly tough and council tax is a priority bill so it's important to keep in contact with your council if you can't keep up payments. Citizens Advice is here to help you find a way forward, without judgement, working with you side by side.

Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk can provide in depth advice on this issue and much more, including debt, finances, employment, benefits and family/relationships. 

¹⁰For Christ's sake we are fools; but you are wise in union with Christ! We are weak, but you are strong! We are despised, but you are honoured!

The 1st of April has become (at least till 12 noon) a time to play tricks and pranks on people, and if they do not realise what is happening, they are called an April fool.

There is even a reference to April fool's day in <u>Geoffrey Chaucer's The</u> <u>Canterbury Tales</u> from 1392. In Medieval times many well-off houses would have their own fool or court jester, their primary purpose was to keep political leaders grounded by entertaining the court aristocracy with crude jokes and performances.

In the Old Testament, a fool was someone who refused to listen to wisdom or learn from discipline, failing to fear God or respect the rules of reality, they repeat their folly much like a dog returns to it's vomit. "Whoever digs a pit will fall into it; if someone rolls a stone, it will roll back on them." (Proverbs. 26:27) But St Paul encourages us to be fools for Christ. I am sure that many people that are not Christians, do think that Christians are fools to believe in something or someone that can't be seen or science can prove. But if we become Fools for Christ it's not about being silly and doing jokes on people, it's about standing up for what we believe in, speaking out for those who cannot speak for themselves, not going along with the latest trends and ideas but being true to God.

Being a fool for Christ of Foolishness for Christ is an old idea that refers to behaviour such as giving up all one's worldly possessions upon joining an <u>ascetic</u> order or religious life, or deliberately flouting society's conventions to serve a religious purpose—particularly of Christianity. Such individuals have historically been known as both "holy fools" and "blessed fools". The term "fool" is often perceived as <u>feeblemindedness</u>, but in these terms, "<u>blessed</u>" or "holy" refers to innocence in the eyes of God.

Today we are all called to be fools for Christ. Our calling is a different way of thinking and being, a way that the world will regard as foolish. If we live out this calling with integrity, if we are truly people of love and grace, if we live sacrificially in service to others, many in the world will be drawn to Christ.

Fr Philip Writes

St Thomas presents a difficulty. His nickname **'Doubting Thomas'** could imply that his faith seems to be in doubt, but so often we overlook other aspects in his life: When the

other apostles weren't keen to follow Jesus to Jerusalem when he said he was going to die, it was Thomas who said, *"Let us join and die with him!"* So what was it that Thomas doubted after the Resurrection? Was it the Resurrection itself or rather the attitude of the others to it? Thomas wasn't with them when the risen Jesus had appeared to them in the locked room where they were hiding. When Thomas returned they said they'd seen Jesus and that he'd eaten with them, but they were just sitting behind locked doors waiting for a new appearance. They weren't giving any sign that his Resurrection had made any difference in their lives, which seemed to be going on just as before. Wa<mark>s this the reason Thomas</mark> didn't believe they had seen the Risen Christ?

Thomas wasn't behind those locked doors but had been bold enough to go out whilst the others were afraid. The enemy to anyone experiencing Christ's resurrected life is FEAR. Fear stops a person opening a door, it disables and causes faith to wither. Thomas was later in the same room when Jesus appeared again and did believe. He said, *"My Lord and my God!"* Jesus then gave authority to all the apostles to forgive the sins of others – the Sacrament of Reconciliation - which enables us to walk as faith people assured that we are healed of the sins and failings that keep us behind locked doors.

A saintly nun told her bishop she was having visions of Jesus. To test her, the bishop said, "Next time you see Jesus, ask him what my great sin was before I became a bishop." Months later when nun returned, the bishop asked what Jesus had told her that sin was. The nun replied: "Jesus said he no longer remembered it!" When Jesus forgives, he forgets. So often we won't let our sins go. Let us make sure we aren't behind 'locked doors' and go out as people of faith, not fear. I pray we will say with St Thomas, "My Lord and my God!" and show by our lives that Jesus is alive in us.


