Parish Council: 50 50 shop building complex at Mendlesham Playingfields:

The building including the 50 50 shop and Mendlesham Football Store has had to be closed further to damage to internal panels believed to be Asbestos.

This building is owned by Mendlesham Memorial Playingfields Charity for which Mendlesham Parish Council is sole Trustee. The building is important to the community either for Mendlesham Community Charity to fund raise and then contribute grants to the Community, or for our local football Mendlesham Football Club to store their equipment including lights that are then used at community events. There is a stagnant £15 in the Charity bank account so the costs of initial reports and investigations have fallen under the financial responsibility of the Parish Council to establish the safety of the building and the cost of any works required to allow the building to be reopened.

Initial surveys will be undertaken later in January which will then indicate which other reports we need for appropriate decisions regarding the future of the building.

In the meanwhile, we hope you understand why the building has to remain closed until further notice.

Moving to Mendlesham has been marvellous, yet despite living on the doorstep of glorious countryside and many intriguing water features, my tiny cottage has presented a small problem; what to hang on its wee walls. And that's tricky for someone who doesn't know their art from their elbow.

I wanted to be fair to (the old part) of the building and display something from 1604, but there's nothing on Amazon dating back four hundred years in the £50-£75 price range, and the sole listings on ebay are for a spoon (£2000) and a Bible (£500). Further research suggests that most relics from the period are, of course, either in St Mary's or the British Museum. As such, back at square one, I decided to buy a cheap blank canvas, which when hung made the living room seem brighter and larger. So I bought a further three.

Then, inspired by the King's well-publicised living Christmas tree, I had half a mind to paint a set of four designs, each using a different living *sauce* – mint, apple, cranberry and horseradish – until the mind's other half put its foot down on the reasoning that the artwork would soon be on the wrong side of hygienic.

So I now face February with four white canvases, or rather four blank pages, four clean slates, four fresh sheets, four windows open for imagination. I may join the Art Group for guidance on how to paint four candles. Questioning visitors, meanwhile, are told that I'm an artist who specialises in snow.

- Local Welfare Assistance Scheme This hardship grant offers payments up to £300 towards the cost of essentials, including energy. Visit the Suffolk County Council website for more information and to apply.
- Surviving Winter offers help, such as fuel vouchers or support for alternative fuels like oil and LPG, to help you heat your home. Apply online via the Citizens Advice Ipswich website or call 01473 298634 to find out if you are eligible.

I've built up a bit of debt and I am panicking. Even though I cut back, Christmas was expensive, my rent has gone up and my pay cheque just doesn't stretch as far as it used to. I'm doing everything I can but it's not enough - what can I do?

First of all it's important to know you're not alone in finding things difficult and, crucially, there's support available.

You say you've built up a bit of debt. The first step is to collect all the information you have about your debts. This might include contracts, bills and statements.

Next, make a list of your debts and write down the details of each. This could include whom you owe the money to (this person/company is your 'creditor'); when you first missed a payment; and how much you now owe. You'll also need to make a note of your account or reference number and what steps the creditor has taken to get the money back, eg. sending you letters.

It might feel overwhelming when you see all of your debts written down - but try not to worry, the important thing is that you're sorting them out.

If you're behind on household bills, prioritise paying your rent or mortgage, plus energy bills and Council Tax first. Not paying these bills has the most serious consequences. You should speak to the person or company you owe money to, to see if there are any manageable steps you can take to start reducing your debt.

Once you've got these debts under control, you should look at any other debts like credit card or store card debts, payday loans or missed Buy Now Pay Later payments. While you're looking at the money going out, do remember to consider money that could be coming in. It's always worth checking if there are any benefits that you're eligible for, including support with your energy costs and living costs.

There's a benefits calculator, advice on how to reduce living costs and information on other ways to increase your income on the National Citizens Advice website at citizensadvice.org.uk

There's also emergency support that you may be able to access locally, such as a food bank, local welfare support or fuel vouchers. We know that times are incredibly tough but please remember, you don't have to face this alone.

Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk can provide in depth advice on this issue and much more, including debt, finances, employment, benefits and family/relationships. 



⁴Love is patient and kind; it is not jealous or conceited or proud; ⁵love is not illmannered or selfish or irritable; love does not keep a record of wrongs; ⁶love is not happy with evil but is happy with the truth. ⁷Love never gives up; and its faith, hope, and patience never fail.

You could say that February is the month of love with February 14th St. Valentine's Day. But who was the saint this day is named after? The history of Valentine's Day and its patron saint is shrouded in mystery. In fact, it is thought that it could be at least three men!

St. Valentine's Day, as we know it today, contains a mixture of both Christian and ancient Roman traditions. Today, the Roman Catholic Church recognizes at least three different saints named Valentine, all of whom were martyred, and parts of their bodies seem to be in many different Churches around the world.

One legend says that Valentine was a priest who served during the third century in Rome. When Emperor Claudius II decided that single men made better soldiers than those with wives and families, he outlawed marriage for young men, his crop of potential soldiers. Valentine, realizing the injustice of the decree, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret. When Valentine's actions were discovered, Claudius ordered that he be put to death.

Other stories suggest that Valentine may have been killed for attempting to help Christians escape harsh Roman prisons where they were often beaten and tortured. *Continued on page 42.....*

According to one legend, Valentine actually sent the first 'Valentine' greeting himself. While in prison, it is believed that Valentine fell in love with a young lady who may have been his jailor's daughter, who visited him during his imprisonment. Before his death, it is alleged that he wrote her a letter, which he signed 'From your Valentine,' which is how many cards are still signed today. The truth behind the Valentine legends are murky, the stories certainly emphasize his appeal as a sympathetic, heroic, and even a romantic figure. By the Middle Ages, Valentine was one of the most popular saints in England and France.

However we view the stories of St Valentine, the stories all have the common theme of sacrifice and love running through them. This reminds us of the narrative of Christ's journey to the cross, the love of God to send his Son to be sacrificed for us on the Cross. God has intervened throughout human history, and this was the greatest sacrifice.

As a human race God has given us freewill to do and think what we want, but God is always there guiding and sustaining. God shows this and his Love by the sacrifice of his Son, just as St Valentine was prepared to sacrifice himself for the love of others, truly living in the way of Christ.

Fr Philip Writes

We begin February with the feast of Candlemass - Jesus is declared by the elderly man Simeon to be a light for all people – and Jesus calls us to be lights for him. Before

the coming of Jesus, God was seen as distant and remote. He was not seen as someone who was concerned with us and our sufferings, but as a stern judge ready to pounce and punish. He needs witnesses – that is, people living in his light who can make him a present reality to other people. Without the witness of Christians, the face of Jesus will fade from our world, our hearts will remain broken and people will remain imprisoned in darkness.



In Jesus, God is seen as loving, close, compassionate and forgiving. He comes to heal, reconcile and save. If Christ is the light of my life, then naturally I will let that light shine through to others by the way I live. We cannot be a light if we are living in darkness.

I love the story of St Lucy, someone who is depicted as bringing light. She was a very early Christian who carried trays of food to others persecuted for their Christian faith and needed both hands free for this, so wore a candle crown on her head. We may not wear candles on our head but we are called to be lights to the homeless, the lonely, the sick, the bereaved and also, of course, to our nearest and dearest. I have often called St Mary's church 'God's hospital'. It is not for those who think they are righteous and not in need of any help. It is for those (which should include all of us) who need God's healing, forgiveness, love and acceptance whatever their past has been. My hope for St Mary's is always to be able to reach out to many for whom life has been difficult. Please do not hesitate to be in touch if you need someone to talk to or someone to listen. One of my favourite BBC TV programmes is 'The Repair Shop' where broken, but treasured objects are



carefully and sometimes amazingly restored by experts. When they are restored to their owners, this always brings incredible joy. That is another symbol of what St Mary's can be for people who have become broken in one way or another – the 'Repair Shop' to restore them back to their former selves in an even

better condition than before – by the help of God and the loving acceptance of other people.


