



Flooding matters:

At our meeting held on 8 November, Parish Councillors, SCC/MSDC Cllr Stringer and members of the public were able to discuss the recent events and implications for those living near to two areas in particular:

- From the Chip Shop to the Heath Centre along Chapel Road.
- From the Mendlesham Playing fields down past the old Fleece
 PH along Old Station Road

Both of these areas have been the subject of conversations, meetings with professional officers and investigations/work over the years. However, all agreed this was something that needed urgent resolution. Cllr Stringer has been asked to take this matter up with Suffolk County Council or any professional partners as it is having such a detrimental effect on those living nearby, as well as those having to use alternative routes and or experience additional traffic to access Mendlesham services. It may be that part of any resolutions may impact on private landowner responsibilities for the drainage systems, but until we have professional guidance, mitigation solutions cannot be found. Thank you to all of those who attended the meeting or have provided information about the recent floods. Please continue to do so as required.





Dear Friends,

As you read this letter, Christmas will be over for many of us, but a few will still be celebrating. For us Christmas is the 25th December but in the Eastern Churches many will not celebrate their Christmas till the 6th January which is Epiphany, 12 days after Christmas, when they remember the coming of the Magi to the baby Jesus with their gifts. Legend tells us that there were 3 of them. This comes from the fact there were 3 gifts. There are other legends that say there were others. One such story by Henry Van Dyke, tells 'The Legend of the Other Wise Man' He was called Artaban, a medium from Ecbatana. He descended from the heavens, and from studying ancient writings learned that a king was about to be born in Israel. He sold all his possessions and purchased three gems, a sapphire, a ruby and a pearl, to give to the newborn king. He missed meeting the other three magi, who met at the Temple of the Seven Spheres, because he had stopped to save a poor man from dying, for which he had had to sell his sapphire. He continued his journey alone. He arrived at Bethlehem too late. Herod's soldiers were massacring the innocents. Artaban saved a baby boy's life by bribing a fierce soldier to spare him, but the price was the ruby. Now he only had one gift for the king. For years he wandered, seeking the king, and found himself in Jerusalem at Passover, which was in uproar. Artaban now had only one of his gifts left - the pearl, but he decided to keep searching for the king. Finally, after 30 years searching, he came to Jerusalem at the time of the Passover. The city was buzzing with talk about the man named Jesus who claimed to be the son of God and who was to be crucified.

Artaban wondered whether he could use his last jewel to save the life of this man, Jesus.

But as he hurried through the streets of the city, Artaban came across a young girl who was crying. She told Artaban she was crying because she was going to be sold into slavery to pay her father's debts. Artaban could not pass by and leave the girl crying so he gave her the pearl, the last of his jewels. At that moment Jesus passed by carrying his cross to the place of execution. He looked at Artaban, and on his face Artaban could see three big drops of blood that looked to him just like a sapphire, a ruby and a pearl. He knew that Jesus was the king he had been looking for all these years, and he also knew that although he was not able to worship his King, his precious gifts had been sold, or given away, to help others, and that was the same as giving them to Jesus.

This story reminds us that Christmas does not stop on the 25th December or even the 6th January but continues all the year as we carry it in our hearts.

Fr Philip Writes

Epiphany - celebrated this year on Sunday 7th

Jan – is when we celebrate the

arrival of the Wise Men. One of the gifts offered to the infant Jesus was GOLD – a sign of his Kingship. We think of kings being remote, but Christ is not like that; he came primarily to SERVE and expects us to live out our faith in the same way – by serving other people. Unless our faith finds such expression, such as in visiting the



lonely, comforting those who are bereaved, feeding those who are hungry, giving clothes to those without any, Jesus says our faith is irrelevant. In the Judgment scene



described vividly in Matthew's Gospel - ch 5 v 31-46 – people are condemned not because of what they have done, but for what they haven't done – sins of omission which include failure to serve other people.

There are many ways to put our faith into practice in a practical way; the **Sockbank** for homeless and vulnerable in Norwich cared for by **St Martin's Housing Trust** is open for socks, hats, gloves, scarves and good used trainers until 7th January, as is the tub by the Crib in church, collecting for **Christian Aid** to people far poorer than we are. All year round the red boxes just inside the church door are there to receive gifts of nonperishable food and toiletries for the **Stowmarket Foodbank**. These are just some ways we can show our faith in practical ways.

The last words said by the celebrant at each Mass is "Go in peace to love and serve

the Lord and to serve each other." May we fulfil this today: I can't think of a better resolution for 2024.

Blessing of Chalk:

It's a custom to bless chalk at Epiphany, for writing a blessing near the main door of a house at the start of the new year:

Teach us, Good Lord, to serve you as you deserve:

To give and not to count the cost

To fight and not to heed the wound;

To toil and not to ask for any reward

Save that of knowing that we are doing your will.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen


